Baldwin son of Jeremiah, merchant of Flanders, who paid it to Luke de Lucca, merchant of Lucca, who has acknowledged before the king that he received it from the said Baldwin to the use of the said Antony.

Mandate to Luke de Luka and his fellows, merchants of Lucca, to pay to Kanca de Scala, and Peter Bonacose, James Amery and his fellows, merchants of Florence, at the next fair of St. Ayoul (*Sancti Aiulphi*) at Provins, out of the moneys arising from the new custom in their custody, 1,000 marks in full payment of a loan of 2,000 marks, from the latter to the king, when he was last at Orvieto (*apud Urbem Veterem*).

The like to the same to pay out of the said money at the said fair to Teglarius Amadoris, James Aymery, Hugelin de Vicchio, and their fellows, merchants of Florence, 500 pounds of Tours, which they advanced, as a loan to the king, to Otto de Grandissono and Anthony Bek, for the latter to deliver to Emeric, vicomte de Rochechouard and Stephen de Monte Forti, knights, in payment of the king's debts, and which the said knights acknowledge they have received.

July 2. Licence for Isaac de Provyns, Jew of Lincoln, to sell to R. bishop of Bath
Barnes. and Wells a debt of 20*l.* wherein Master John de la Lade, lately deceased, was bound to him.

The like for Aaron de la Rye, Jew of London, to sell to the said bishop a like debt of 15*l.* of the said Master John.

July 5. Mandate to the seneschal of Gascony not to molest Garsio de la Marche,
Barnes. but to permit him to stay in peace in Gascony, the king have remitted his rancour against him for adhering to Gaston de Bierni, who was lately in arms against the king there.

June 24. Grant to the good men of Thomas de Clare of li Hyochil in Ireland, at
Westminster. the instance of the said Thomas, their lord, of murage for seven years from Michaelmas, 3 Edward I.

July 4. Licence for Robert son of Walter to sell to Robert, archbishop of Can-
Barnes. terbury, the castle called Castle Baynard, or the area thereof, near the city-wall, with its appurtenances, whether in dykes, stone walls, void areas or even in the tower called the tower of Fish Street Hill (*Turris Montis Fisheti*), on condition that by reason of such sale no harm or prejudice be caused in other goods belonging to him and his heirs or his barony, and saving to him and his heirs all other things belonging to the said castle or barony, as well in rents, his port and putting in (*applicacione*) of ships, as in other liberties, whether in the city of London or elsewhere, belonging to his said barony.

Writ *de intendendo* directed to the tenants of the abbey of St. Benet's, Hulme, for Nicholas de Walsham, the prior, elected to be abbot.

Mandate to John de London, escheator this side Trent, to restore to him the temporalities.

July 10. Acceptance of a grant, for life, by John Wyger and Ralph de Broghton,
Kempton. who were lately sent to the islands of Gerese and Gernese to make inquisitions, to Laurence called 'Payn' of the island of Gerese, of 5 virgates of land of the escheat of Ralph Water in the parish of St. Saviours, at a rent of two quarters of wheat and the usual services.

Acceptance of the account rendered by Stephen de Houeden by the king's order to Master Raymond de Nolmeriis, constable of the castle of Tykehull and keeper of the manor of Gringeleye, for the time that he held
