Acquittance to Constance late the wife of Richard de Tillebiry of 100 marks paid to John de London, escheator this side Trent, in part payment of a fine of 200 marks for the custody of the lands and marriage of the heirs of the said Richard.

MEMBRANE 5.

Oct. 23. Commission of oyer and terminer to Guichard de Charrun and William Westminster. de Northburgh touching a complaint which Walter de Swethop came to the king's court to make against Gilbert de Humframvill for having, after the termination of the late disturbance of the realm and the proclamation of the peace of Henry III., taken him and imprisoned him in the castle of Hirbotel, exacted from him a fine of 100 marks for his liberation, and after the proclamation of the peace of Edward I. further extorted from him, through Elizabeth wife of the said Gilbert, by threats of injury to his body and goods, and the burning of his houses, a sum of 10*l.*; for destroying a house of the said Walter at Dortrees, co. Northumberland, driving two of his mares from his common pasture with their foals to the forest of Redesdale, and branding them with his own mark; and, after all this, for continuing, after the king had taken the said Walter, his men and possessions, into his protection, to take away his cattle, beat his men, and inflict such damage on him that he cannot exercise his accustomed hospitality, and is hardly able to support himself and his children.

MEMBRANE 4.

Oct. 30. Mandate to Luke de Tany, seneschal of Gascony, to discharge the sum Westminster. due to John de Gresley for the arrears on his lands in Gascony, which the king has lately restored to him.

Nov. 6. Writ *de intendendo* to the tenants of Faversham abbey, for Oswald de Westminster. Estri, elected abbot, the election of John de Romenhale, one of the monks, having been quashed by R. archbishop of Canterbury.

Mandate to John de London, escheator this side Trent, to restore to him the temporalities.

Nov. 5. Grant as above to Robert, count of Boulogne. Westminster. *Vacated because surrendered and cancelled.*

Memorandum that on 5 November, 3 Edward I. a letter of Henry III. dated at Westminster, 29 October, 54 Henry III. was surrendered and cancelled, being an acknowledgment of his indebtedness to the said count in 400*l.*, arrears of his yearly fee of 200*l.* at the Exchequer, with promise to pay the following Easter.

Nov. 7. Grant to Gilot le Tailur, for services to the king and queen-consort, of Westminster. the custody, during the minority of the heir, of the lands in Burnham, late of Reiner Gimingham, tenant in chief, saving to the king the marriage of the heir.

Nov. 7. Licence for William de Cavereswell to crenellate his house of Cavereswell. Westminster.

Acquittance to William de Hevere, sheriff of Sussex, of 56*s.* 8*d.*, delivered by him by precept to Master William de Luda, king's clerk, out of the amercements of wool made before John de Lovetot, in the said county.
