Appointment of the provost and confraternity of St. Edward, Acre, and their successors, to the custody, during pleasure, of the tower which the king caused to be built there.

Writ *de intendendo* directed to the knights, freemen and others of the islands of Gernese and Gerese for Otto de Bono Villar[io], Master William de Sancto Remigio and Philip le Eveske, appointed as justices to hold assises and all other pleas this turn within those islands.

Protection with clause *volumus*, for one year, for Ralph Pypard and Sibyl his wife, commorant in Ireland on the king's service.

Grant to Arnold de Gerundia of a penalty of 300 marks which will be due to the king from Arnold de Jusikes if the latter should incur such penalty.

Power to Roger de Mortuo Mari to enfeoff in the king's name the men of the king's lands pertaining to his castles and demesnes of Gannok, of Rothelan, and of Flint, and to demise and grant the same in fee-farm by carucates or other certain parcels on condition that the feoffees and farmers pay their rents and services within the said towns and castles; and he may remit to them such rents and services for one, two, or three years on condition that such rents be applied by them to the repair of their houses in the said castles and towns and the cultivation of the said lands.

Mandate in pursuance to the sheriffs of Gloucester, Hereford and Worcester to make proclamation for all those who wish to become feoffees or farmers to appear before the said Roger at Hereford a week after Hilary; to the sheriff of Salop and Stafford for such persons to appear at Shrewsbury a fortnight after Hilary; and to the sheriffs of Warwick and Leicester, Nottingham and Derby, Lancaster and Guncelin de Badelesmere, justice [of Chester] for such persons to appear at Rothelan on Sunday in Mid-Lent.

Letters for William de Fenles, nominating William de Amesas his attorney for one year.

Mandate to the justices next in eyre for pleas of the forest in Wilts not to molest Matthew de Columbariis, keeper of the forest of Chet, and William son of Warin, king's serjeant, for taking, by the king's order, with dogs and nets in the bailiwick of the said Matthew in 6 Edward I. twenty-four live bucks to stock Odiham Park, eight live does to be delivered to Patrick de Cadurcis of the king's gift, and fifty-six does for the king's larder.
