Letters for Richard, abbot of Westminster, nominating brothers John de Sutton and Alexander de Staundon his attorneys until a year after Whitsunday.

Protection with clause *volumus*, until Christmas, for Master Walter de la Marche, parson of the church of Mudle, going beyond seas with the said abbot.

Licence for Raymond Eymar and John de Solys, his fellow, merchants of Cahurs, to sell the cloths which they have at present in England or which they shall bring in before Midsummer, notwithstanding the late prohibition of cloths not having the right measure.

Mandate to Reiner de Luka and Orlandinus de Podio and their fellows, merchants of Lucca, to pay Thomas de Sancto Vigore and Master Henry Heose, the king's envoys, lately returning from the court of Rome, 100s. for their expenses.

The like to the same to pay Thomas de Sandwico, going as the king's envoy to Brabant, 20 marks for his expenses.

The like to the same to pay the abbot of Westminster, going as the king's envoy to Brabant, 50*l.* for his expenses.

Simple protection, for one year, for John le Josne of London, going to Scotland to trade.

Mandate to the above Reiner de Luka and his fellows to pay Henry de Lacy, earl of Lincoln, 500*l.* which the king has lent to him.

To the same effect with the following notes:—'By Anthony Bek.' 'This writ ought to be directed to Reiner de Luka and Giles de Audenardo, receivers of the fifteenth, because it is from the money of the fifteenth.' [A further unfinished note is struck out.]

Grant to Edmund, the king's brother, of the custody, during the minority of the heirs, of the lands late of Gilbert le Fraunceys, tenant in chief.

*Vacated because surrendered and cancelled.*

Mandate to the prior and convent of Worcester to pay at once the 150*l.* they were ordered to pay to the justice of Chester or Nicholas Bonel, king's clerk, of the king's money deposited with them for making the king's works in the March.

Grant to Master Henry de Neuwerk, canon of Hereford, that as long as he has that prebend, he shall have free warren in all the demesne lands of his prebend of La Berton in Colewell and Hope, co. Hereford, provided that those lands are not within the metes of the forest.

Grant to the mayor, sheriffs and citizens of London of murage for three years from 24 February, 7 Edward I.

Writ *de intendendo* to the tenants of the priory of Kenilworth for Richard de Tyvelesford, one of the canons, elected prior.

Mandate to Robert de Verdun, sheriff of Warwick, escheator in that county, to restore the temporalities.
