Pardon to Richard son of Jordan de Preston, in Carlisle gaol for the death of Roger Pacok, on testimony before the king by Alan de Walkingham and Gilbert de Corewen, justices appointed to deliver that gaol, that he killed him by misadventure.

Letters for Thomas, prior of Christchurch, Canterbury, nominating Ralph de Shireburn and John de Bristoll his attorneys in Ireland for one year.

Presentation of Richard de Bereford to the church of Wemmeworth in the diocese of Exeter, in the king's gift by reason of his custody of the land and heir of John Wyger, tenant in chief.

Pardon to David le Keu for the death of William son of William de Ellinton, as it appears by inquisition made by the sheriff and coroners of Northumberland that he killed him by misadventure.

Grant to the bailiffs and good men of Carlisle that they may continue to take for five years from Michaelmas, 8 Edward I., the murage granted to them for a period now elapsed.

*Inspeximus* of a charter of Edward, firstborn of Henry III., to the abbot, monks and brethren of the abbey of Dundreynan in Galloway, dated at Barnard Castle, 13 April, 51 Henry III. and directed to all bailiffs of Ireland, as also of Dublin and Drogheda, mayors, reeves, citizens and burgesses, taking the said abbeve and their men, at the instance of John de Balliolo, under the said Edward's protection in going to his land of Ireland, staying there and returning thence and granting to them, even though any prohibition should be made of buying or carrying corn out of Ireland for a time, power to buy and carry thence yearly 120 crannocks of wheat and the like of oats or flour, wine and other victuals for the sustenance of their house, and ordering 10*l.* to be taken for a forfeiture from any person impeding the abbot and his monks against this grant.

Exemption, at the instance of Master William de Cornera, king's clerk, to Roger de la Ryvere from being put upon assises, juries or recognisances, and from being made coroner or other bailiff for life.

Protection with clause *volumus*, for two years, for William son of Warin, going to Ireland on the king's affairs.

Licence for the Friars Preachers of Newcastle-on-Tyne to make a narrow gate through the new wall surrounding the said town, which will have to be made through the garden of the said friars, for ingress into the said garden, and for them and their successors to hold the same on condition that the sheriff of Northumberland or the constable of the castle of the said town may stop it when they please for a time.

Grant to them of the moiety of that street which adjoins their own place on the west for the enlargement of the same.

Whereas on 13 November, 7 Edward I. the king granted to Robert son of John, in satisfaction of his fee of 25*l.*, the custody, during the minority of the heirs, of the lands late of John de Bohun, tenant in chief, in Luton, extended at 17*l.* yearly, and the lands late of Ralph de Bukeham, in the king's hands by reason of the voidance of the abbey of St. Edmund's, whereof the said Ralph held, extended at 14*l.* yearly; and the said Robert was to be answerable at the Exchequer for the excess of 6*l.* yearly; the king now pardons him the said excess of 6*l.* yearly and the arrears thereof from the above date.
