Licence for the alienation in mortmain by Martin de Pecham, clerk, to the abbess and nuns of Fontevrault (*Fontis Ebrordi*), of a messuage of 100 acres of land in the latter's manor of Leghton.

May 24. Grant to Oliver de Kybrak of the custody, during the minority of the  
Westminster. heirs, of the lands late of John de Pavely, tenant in chief, saving to the king the knights' fees, the advowsons pertaining to the said lands, and the marriage of the heirs, and to Eva, late the wife of the said John, her reasonable dower.

Letters for the abbot of Savigny, nominating Ralph Feverer and Henry son of William de Braunston his attorneys for two years.

Simple protection, for two years, for Bogo de Clare, going beyond seas.

Safe-conduct, for one year, for the men of Gregory de Rokeslec and Richard de Childewell, citizen of London, bringing a ship laden with corn to Ireland.

Royal assent to the election of John Edrich, one of the canons, to be prior of Kermerdin.

May 25. Letters for Bogo de Clare, going beyond seas, nominating Hugh de  
Westminster. Coleworth and William de Milkesham his attorneys for two years.

Appointment, during pleasure, of Thomas de Normanvill, king's steward, to the custody of the priory of Newbrough, which is in debt.

Licence for Stephen de Penecestre and Margaret his wife to crenellate their house of Alinton, co. Kent.

May 26. Pardon to John le Beverli' of Erlestok for the death of William de la  
Westminster. Forde, as it appears by inspection of the rolls of Henry III. that the latter, at the instance of Edmund, the king's brother, pardoned him the same.

Protection with clause *volumus*, for five years, for Walter de Abindon, going to the land of Jerusalem.

Appointment of John de Gernemuta, king's clerk, and Richard de Araz, the bearers, to receive the money due from Guy, count of Flanders, according to the form of the peace made between him and the king.

*Vacated.*

Letters for David, archbishop of Cashel, staying in England, nominating Adam le Blund his attorney in Ireland for two years.

Writ *de intendendo* to the tenants of the priory of Britelwell *alias* Pritelwell for Nicholas de Cokefeld, late prior of Cliff[ord]e, preferred to be prior thereof by P. sub-prior of Lewes, and W. prior of the monks of Thetford, vice-gerents of John, prior of Lewes, of the Cluniac order, during his absence beyond seas.

Mandate to Richard de Holebrok, king's steward, to restore to him the temporalities.

Writ *de intendendo* to the bailiffs and good men of Portesmouth for Eleanor the king's mother, to whom the king has granted for life that town as of the value of 18*l.* 4*s.* 8*d.*

Simple protection, for one year, for Thomas de Lond[on], Thomas de Sanford, and John Hulyn, serjeants-at arms, going to Wales on the king's affairs.

May 25. Commission of oyer and terminer to J. de Lovetot and R. de Holebrok,  
Westminster. touching the persons who broke the houses of John de Hegham at Baketon co. Norfolk, and carried away his corn.
