Appointment of Godfrey Merillon, clerk, to the office of escheator of the county of Chester during pleasure.

Nov. 27. Appointment of Stephen de Penecestre, Iter[ius] de Engolisma, and Westminster. Henry le Waleys to assess certain plots of land (*placias*) at Ihamme, and to let them to the barons and goodmen of Winchelse for building; saving to the immediate lords of the aforesaid plots a reasonable extent of every acre.
