 July 28.
 Fareham. Commission of oyer and terminer, for the second time, to Hugh de Cressingham and John Wogan by jury of the parts of Westwales, Haverford, the bishopric of St. Davids and Pembroke, touching the port of Muleford and the metes and bounds between the towns of Haverford and Pembroke; as it appears that delay arose in enquiring into some articles because Master Ralph de Ivingho and his fellows, justices appointed to hear and determine complaints against ministers of Eleanor, the late queen-consort, omitted to send the said commissioners the record and process of a plaint on behalf of William de Valencia, the king's uncle, and Joan his wife, touching divers of those articles. Any points determined during the life of the said Eleanor are to remain unaltered. By K.

 Fareham. Commission of oyer and terminer to John de Botetourte and William son of William Gerberge the younger, on complaint by Reynbricghtus de Greninge and Folcardus de Greninge, merchants of Almain, that when their ship was in the port of Brunham, co. Norfolk, certain persons carried away goods therefrom. By K.
- Aug. 3.
 Fareham. Commission of oyer and terminer to William de Carleton and William de Gerberge the younger, on complaint by Robert Tibotot, who is under the king's special protection, that Ralph de Langeleye of Edwardeston, Ralph his son and Roesia his wife, William le Carpenter of Aketon, Robert Rumhaund, Robert Mone and Roger Mone of Edwardeston, entered the manor of Edwardeston, co. Suffolk, now in his custody by the king's appointment, carried away his goods there, which they detain, and assaulted his men.
- The like to William de Bereford and Ralph de Berners, on petition of the appellees, touching an appeal which Isabella, late the wife of Elias Bolay, brings in the county of Kent against Richard Attepette of Chalke, Alice his wife, John le Barbour, clerk, Robert Cubert of Culinge, William de Hyrye of Merston and William de Eylesham for the death of her husband, and against Ralph Attepette of Chalke, and Robert Turk of London for receiving them.  Fareham. Commission to Robert Malet and William de Bereford to view the gorges and weirs in the Thames in the counties of Middlesex, Surrey, Berks, Buckingham and Oxford, as it appears that divers magnates and others having tenements by the river Thames and the river of the moor of Ottemor, between the city of London and the said moor, have erected gorges and weirs where they were not wont to be, and have straitened and raised the height of others, and that fishermen and others take small fish with narrow nets and kidels contrary to the assize in these and other rivers in the said counties; by reason whereof vessels cannot pass as they were wont. They are to remove all weirs made or raised contrary to the assize, and to burn such nets and destroy the kidels.
- The like to Thomas de Hakeford and Richard de Cokefeld to deliver Great Yarmouth gaol of all persons except those who were indicted before John Botetourt and Peter de Campania, justices appointed to hear and determine trespasses committed against the men from Hoyland of Florence, count of Hoyland, &c., as above.

 Fareham. Commission of oyer and terminer to William de Mortuo Mari and Walter de Redmerleye touching the persons who broke the park of Peter de Eylesford, king's clerk, who is going to Gascony on the king's service and is under the king's special protection, at Kingespenne, co. Hereford, hunted therein and carried away deer.

 Portsmouth. Commission of oyer and terminer to J. de Berewyk, H. de Cressingham and William de Carleton, on complaint by Guy Ferre the younger, who is
