May 5.  
Stirling.      Mandate to Thomas, archbishop of York, primate of England, to induct Master John Bouhs of London, king's clerk, into the chapel or sacristy of St. Mary and the Holy Angels, York, in the king's gift by reason of the late voidance of the archbishopric, the king having granted it to him. By p.s.
- The like to the same to induct the said Master John into the prebend of Styvelyngton, in the church of St. Peter, York. By p.s.
- May 28.  
Stirling.      Letters for John, duke of Brittany and earl of Richmond, staying beyond seas, nominating Janiettus de Sancto Albino and William de Merk his attorneys for two years.
- May 18.  
Stirling.      Licence, in consideration of a fine made by the prioress before the treasurer and barons of the Exchequer, for the alienation in mortmain by John de Beaumeys to the prioress and nuns of Brewode of 10 acres of land and 10 acres of wood in Donyton.
- May 20.  
Stirling.      The like, in consideration of a fine made by the prior in the chancery, for the alienation in mortmain by Roger de Cantebrigg to the prior and convent of Dunmawe of 10 acres of land and a moiety of an acre of meadow in Great Salingg.
- May 19.  
Stirling.      Pardon, out of devotion to St. Edmund, to the abbot and convent of St. Edmunds, for acquiring in mortmain 8 acres of meadow in Fornham St. Martin, Fornham St. Genevieve and Fornham All Saints, by feoffment of Robert de Northworth and a messuage and 60 acres of land in Bradefeld by feoffment of Henry Bacun.
- May 20.  
Stirling.      Grant, out of devotion to St. Edmund, to the abbot and convent of St. Edmunds, that the prior and convent and their successors shall in time of voidance have the custody of the abbey and of all its temporalities, as the abbots and convents have been accustomed to have, and as the abbot and convent may ordain when an abbot is in possession, saving to the king knight's fees and advowsons of churches that fall in during such voidance, but the rents and services arising from the said fees to remain during voidance to the prior and convent; also saving to the king escheats that fall in during voidance, but the same, after the conclusion of the voidance, to wit, after the new abbot has done his fealty, to remain to the abbot, prior and convent. If the voidance last a year or less, 1,200 marks is to be paid; if longer, payment at that rate is to be made in proportion. No sheriff, escheator or other bailiff or minister of the king is, during voidance, to intermeddle in the custody of the abbey or its cells, manors or goods, except that the escheator or other king's minister shall take simple seisin thereof in the name of the king's lordship, and straightway retire without taking or carrying away anything, and without staying there more than one day or substituting any one in his place. Lastly, if, in time of voidance, the king happen to be summoning the army, the prior and convent and their successors shall not be found to service therein for their own demesne knight's fees of the abbey at such time in their hands.

Stirling.      Grant to the abbot and convent of St. Edmunds of murage for three years in aid of their town of St. Edmunds. By K. on the like information.

Stirling.      Pardon to Geoffrey de Hauvill, king's yeoman and falconer, for taking a stag in the forest of Rokyngham. By p.s.
- June 1.  
Stirling.      Mandate to Walter de Gloucestre, escheator beyond Trent, to restore the temporalities of the bishopric of London to Master Ralph de Baudak, dean of St. Pauls, elected bishop.
- Writ *de intendendo* directed to the tenants.
