Nov. 21.
Burstwick. Grant to Maurice de Pissiac, king's clerk, of the prebend which Master William Burnel had in the church of St. Peter, York, in the king's gift by reason of the voidance of the archbishopric of York. By p.s.
Mandate in pursuance to the dean and chapter.

Burstwick. Licence for John Lovel of Tichemersh to crenellate his manor of Tichemersh, co. Northampton. By p.s.
- Nov. 22.
Burstwick. Licence, in consideration of a fine made by the abbot before W. bishop of Coventry and Lichfield, treasurer for the alienation in mortmain by Thomas de Elmyngham to the abbot and convent of West Derham of a moiety of a mill and of a rood of meadow in Riglond.
- Nov. 21.
Burstwick. Exemplification, by reason of its age and the weakness of the seal, of a charter of Henry [I.], sometime king of England, dated at Windsor and addressed to the archbishop of York, the justices, sheriffs, barons and subjects, French and English, of Yorkshire and Carlisle, whereby he grants and confirms to the church of St. Mary, York, and the abbot Geoffrey and monks serving God there, the cell of St. Constantine, with the manor of Wederhal, with the chapel of Warthewic and the sluice (*cum exclusagio*) and stank of the fishery and mill of Wederh[ale] made in the land of Corkeby, as they held it when Ranulph, earl of Chester, held Carleol, and confirming to them the whole pasture between Edene and the high road leading from Carleol to Eppelby and from Wederhal to Driebec, and granting to them the forest for their pigs of Wederhal without pannage. Also granting and confirming to them their churches, goods, possessions, lands and all things given to them by the charters of the king's good men, prohibiting any one from doing them contumely. And they are to have their customs and lands and goods quit of aids and tallages and all things like as the church of St. Peter in York and St. John in Beverley, and to have all the liberties that those churches have. Burstwick. Letters for Elias de Albinaco, going beyond seas, nominating Richard de Loveny and Rolandinus de Colbar his attorneys for one year. By p.s.
- Nov. 25.
Burstwick. Restitution to Constance de Byern of the castle and honor of Tykhill and the manors of Wheteley, Gryngeley and Frodesham, taken into the king's hands by reason of her adhering to the party of the king of France in the recent war in Gascony.
