Licence for John de Parva Hereford, chaplain, celebrating divine service in the chapel of the manor of Eton Suwaye for the souls of John Tregoz, his ancestors and successors, to hold, in frank almain, a messuage and 3 virgates of land in Eton Suwaye which are held in chief, and which the said John Tregoz in his lifetime gave, in fee simple, to Henry de Martle, chaplain, predecessor of the present chaplain for the above purpose. April 7. Simple protection, for two years, for Stephen, prior of Lewes, going to

Westminster. Humphrey Wace, before John de Metingham and his fellows, justices of the Bench, whereon he was condemned to gaol, but could not be found; on condition that he surrender immediately to gaol and stay there until he has satisfied the king for what pertains to him and the said Humphrey for the trespass.
