Mandate to the good men of Kyngeston-upon-Hull to observe in their town the statute provided in London for foreign vouchers in warranty [Statute of Gloucester, 6 Edward I.], and the subsequent provision that a tenant make no waste or estrepement of a tenement during such plea.

Pardon to Walter de Chaldecote of his outlawry before William Martyn and his fellows, justices of oyer and terminer in the county of Dorset, when indicted of a robbery from Walter de Kynford and Thomas Goby of 20 marks at Stykelane, on condition that he surrender immediately to gaol.

The like to David Rys of his outlawry before the same in the county of Devon, for the burglary of the houses of Richard Bisshop of Tengewyk and Osbert de la Stone, and the carrying away of their goods.

Appointment of Ralph de Dalton, king's clerk, and William le Getour to purvey ships and vessels and men therein along the shore in the bishopric of Durham and the county of Northumberland to repress the Scots. Robert de Clifford, lord of Hertelpol, and the mayor and bailiffs thereof, and the sheriffs of Durham and Northumberland are commanded to assist.

The like of John de Derby, king's clerk, and John Gentyll, along the shore in the county of Lancaster.

Jan. 30.

The like of Simon de Monte Acuto as captain and governor of the fleet against the Scots, as well in the parts of Scotland as in the isles between Scotland and Ireland.

Writ *de intendendo* for him directed to the masters and mariners of the ships of the said fleet.

The like to the sheriff of Lancaster for the above John de Derby and John Gentyll.

Feb. 1.

Appointment of William de Mulcastre, sheriff of Cumberland, and James de Dalileye, to get ready empty ships and barges at Skymburneys, Whitothavene and Wyrkinton, and elsewhere by the shore in that county, and find them in men and necessaries to go to the parts of Are to repress the malice of Robert de Brus and his accomplices.

Writ *de intendendo* in pursuance to the men of that county.

Appointment of John du Luda, as captain and governor of the fleet from the ports of Skymburnesse, Whitothavene and Wyrkinton in like manner as Simon de Monte Acuto is appointed above.

Safe conduct for William le Getur, whom the king is sending with part of the shipping to divers parts of the land of Scotland to repress the malice of Robert de Brus the traitor and his accomplices.
