 March 20. Grant to John de Kirkeby, king's clerk, in consideration of a fine of 50*l.* Carlisle. made before W. bishop of Coventry and Lichfield, the treasurer, of the marriage of Walter son and heir of John de Cirezy, who held of the king in chief as of the castle of Barnard Castle, late of John de Balliolo, and in the king's hands by reason of his rebellion, or of the next heir until he has the effect of the marriage. By pet. of C.
 Mandate in pursuance to Robert de Clifford, keeper of the liberty of the bishopric of Durham.
- May 28. Appointment of John Abel to survey the castle of Pevenese reported to Carlisle. be ruinous, and certify the treasurer and barons of the Exchequer of the state thereof. By pet. of C.
- May 7. Pardon to John le Rous of Kyme of his outlawry before Peter de Malo Carlisle. Lacu and his fellows, justices of oyer and terminer in the county of Lincoln, for divers felonies, on condition that he surrender to Lincoln gaol.
 The like to Thomas de Burgo, son of John de Empyngham, of the like before the same, for the death of William de Warenner of Burroth, on like condition.
- May 28. Licence for Amicia de la Rivere to grant, in fee simple, to John de la Carlisle. Rivere, her son, the manor of Hampton by Creckelade, which is held in chief, and which Richard de la Rivere holds for life by demise of Amicia; and grant that if Amicia survive Richard, the manor shall revert to her for life, and after her death to John. By p.s.
- June 1. Licence for the prior and convent of Worcester to appropriate the church Carlisle. of Lyndrugg, in the diocese of Hereford, of their own patronage, in order to augment their convent by three monks and to find two wax-lights continually burning before the shrine of St. Wulstan. By p.s.
- June 2. Licence for the alienation in mortmain by Robert Aleyn to the abbot and Carlisle. convent of Lavenden of a messuage, 20 acres of land and 2 acres of meadow; by Alice la Proude of 2 acres of land and $\frac{1}{2}$ acre of meadow; and by William le Engleys of 3*s.* rent, all in Lathebury.
- May 22. Grant to Laurence de la Ryvere of the custody, during the minority of Carlisle. heir, of the lands in Ireland, late of James de Bohun, tenant in chief. By p.s.
- May 16. Letters for Arnold de Cantilup, cardinal, dean of St. Paul's, London, Carlisle. staying beyond seas, nominating Gregory de Falguariis and Visianus de Blanqafort, clerks, his attorneys for three years.
- June 5. Presentation of Thomas de Lufwyk to the church of Rokingham, in the Carlisle. diocese of Lincoln, void by the resignation of Master William de Wodefod.
- June 5. Appointment of Richard le Lou to the custody, during the minority of Carlisle. the heir, of the manor of West Wittenham, in the king's hands by reason of the minority of the heir of Beatrice, late the wife of Giles de Brewosa, deceased, who (*que*) held in chief; at a rent, by the hands of the escheator beyond Trent, of 13*l.* 5*s.*, its extent. On the information of the treasurer.
 Mandate in pursuance to Walter de Gloucester, the said escheator.
 On the like information.
- June 2. Pardon to John Graundyn of his outlawry, before Peter de Malo Lacu Carlisle. and his fellows, justices of oyer and terminer in the county of Lincoln, for divers felonies, on condition that he surrender to Lincoln gaol.

 Nov. 10. The like to John Phyvian, 'le ferour,' in consideration of his service in Dunfermline. Scotland, for the death of Warin Wysman of Pethawe, and of any consequent outlawry.
