- March 26.  
Windsor. Confirmation of a grant by Hugh le Despenser to Amadeus, count of Savoy, of houses in Paris and elsewhere in France. [*Fœdera.*]
- April 2.  
Windsor. Protection with clause *volumus*, until Whitsuntide, for Thomas de Insula, going beyond seas on the king's service.  
Peter Amaluini, canon of Bordeaux, going beyond seas, has letters nominating Roger Peperwhyte and Robert le Dorturer his attorneys for one year.
- April 4.  
Windsor. Protection with clause *volumus*, for one year, for Adam Russel, going beyond seas with Master Jordan Moraunt on the king's service.  
On the testimony of Jordan Moraunt.
- April 1.  
Windsor. Licence for John le Strange (*Extraneo*) to crenellate his dwelling-house of Medle. By p.s.[130.]
- March 25.  
Westminster. Appointment of Roger de Heggham, Gilbert de Roubiry and Master Richard de Abyndon, or two of them, to assess the fifteenth for the city and suburbs of London and to send the rolls of the assessment to the treasurer and barons of the Exchequer, that the tax may be levied by summons of the Exchequer. [*Parl. Writs.*]
- April 2.  
Windsor. Master Peter Aymercy, going beyond seas on the king's service, has letters nominating William de Ayremynne, clerk, and Roger Peperwhyte his attorneys for one year.  
Protection, with clause *volumus*, for him for the same period.
- March 31.  
Caversham. Commission to John de Canti Lupo, Nicholas de Asteleye, Robert de Verdon and the sheriff of the county of Warwick, conservators of the peace for that county, to enquire touching confederacies of divers persons at Arderne, in that county, whereby the people of that neighbourhood are intimidated, and to arrest the offenders. [*Parl. Writs.*] By p.s.
- April 1.  
Windsor. Grant, upon fine, to John de Sindlesham of the custody of the lands of William de Erle, deceased, tenant in chief, which are extended at 6*l.* 18*s.* 6*d.* a year by Walter de Gloucester, escheator on this side Trent, knights' fees, advowsons and dowers excepted, which are reserved to the king, together with the marriage, without disparagement, of John his son and heir. Should the heir die during his minority, his heir being under age, John de Sindlesham is to have the custody for such length of time as he would hold it if the minor survived, and he is to receive reasonable compensation, if the next heir be of full age. By bill of Exchequer.

- April 2.  
Windsor. Grant, for life, to John son of Reginald son of Peter of the castles, towns and manors of Bleyneveny and Blockedynas, the town and manor of Talgarth, the manor of Caldecote in Wales, which, with the exception of a carucate of land in Cunduy purchased by him from Rees ap Howel, and another in Wylfayth purchased from Miles Pychard, he had previously surrendered to the king. By p.s.  
Commission to Ralph de Thedmersshe, king's yeoman, to deliver seisin thereof to him.  
Mandate in pursuance to Ralph de Thedmersshe.
- April 3.  
Windsor. Richard de Crofton, going to Gascony with Master Jordan Moraunt on the king's service, has letters nominating John de Cosinton and John de Kyngeston his attorneys for two years.
