March 4. Commission of oyer and terminer to John de Insula, Hugh de Louther  
Westminster. and Geoffrey de Hothum, on complaint by William de Sancta Barbara that John Talle, William de Scorburch', Henry Menel, John Osbern of Sumersete, William le Sutherun, William Cundy, Robert Talle chaplain, and Walter Wade of Bilton assaulted him, broke his house at Riseby, co. York, and carried away his goods.

March 6. The like to William de Ormesby, John Bretun and Robert de Retf[ord],  
Westminster. on complaint by Hugh de Wykegtoft, Ralph Russel, John de Fenne, Andrew Baggard and Stephen de Parteneye, merchants of Holland, that divers inhabitants of Depedale, Thornham, Brauncester, Holm and Tychevelle, co. Norfolk, plundered a ship, chartered by them to convey herrings and other goods from Gernemuthe to Boston, when in distress off the coast, and had driven the crew out of her as though she was a wreck.

March 6. The like to John de Insula, Hugh de Louther and Thomas de Fisshe-  
Westminster. burne, on complaint by Robert de Sancto Paulo that Isabella, late the wife of John son of Hugh, Gregory de Thornton, Peter de Barton and others carried away his corn at Whitingham, co., Northumberland, during his absence in Scotland on the service and under the protection of the king.

March 7. Commission to William de Bereford, Gilbert de Roubury and Geoffrey de  
Westminster. Hertelpol, as under a like commission of the late king to William de Bereford and William Howard nothing has been done, to enquire into the petition of the commonalty of the city of York, alleging that Walter de Langeton, master of the hospital of St. Leonard, York, and his predecessors had appropriated divers tenements held of the king, set up crosses in the same to the king's prejudice, encroached upon the jurisdiction of the court of their city, appropriated part of the stone wall and ditch of the city between the hospital and the abbey of St. Mary, broken down the wall, carried away the stones, and had closed up a public path leading to the city wall.

March 8. Commission associating William Howard and Hervey de Staunton with  
Westminster. Roger le Brabazon, William de Bereford, Gilbert de Roubury and John le Blund, justices, to examine and correct an alleged error in an assize of novel disseisin in the court of the city of London, between Gilbert le Sauturer and Master Jordant Moraunt, touching a messuage and four shops in the city.

March 6. Commission to Roger de Bella Fago and John de Batesford, upon the  
Westminster. memorial of the commonalty of the county of Devon, to audit the accounts of the murage granted to the citizens of Exeter by the late king, and to report upon the application of it to that purpose, what surplus there is, and in whose hands the same may be.

March 8. Commission of oyer and terminer to John de Insula, Hugh de Louthere  
Westminster. and Thomas de Fischeburne touching the rape of Joan, the wife of Thomas son of Ducal Macdowel, at Carlisle, co. Cumberland, and the taking away of his goods.

March 9. Commission *de wallis et fossatis* to William Howard, John le Bretun  
Westminster. and Thomas de Ingeldesthorpe, touching the banks, sewers, bridges, causeys (*calceta*) and weirs along the sea-coasts and adjacent parts in the county of Norfolk.
