- Oct. 22. Pardon to William Marchaunt of Fayrstedde for the death of Thomas  
Westminster. Scut' of Melton, as it appears upon the record of William de Ormesby and  
John le Bretun, justices of gaol delivery for Norwich that he killed him  
in self-defence.
- Oct. 4. Licence to Henry de Percy to crenellate his dwelling-houses of Spofford  
Westminster. and Lekyngfeld, co. York, and Petteworth, co. Sussex. By K.
- Oct. 21. Pardon of the outlawry of Robert de Reymerston for not satisfying the  
Westminster. late king for the ransom for his default in not prosecuting Thomas de  
Couteshale of Bishop's Lynn (*Lenna Episcopi*), for the rape and abduction  
of Alice his wife, provided he now satisfy the king.
- Oct. 25. Licence, upon fine, for Robert son of Walter to grant, for life, to Elena  
Westminster. daughter of Peter de Benardeston a rent of 10*l.* in Disce, held in chief.
- Nov. 8. Exemplification of a grant, 5 January, 35 Edward I., to John Page,  
Westminster. yeoman of the chamber, of the forestership of Derewentfelles, the original  
letters patent having been stolen.
- Nov. 10. Licence for Katherine, late the wife of Nicholas de Aldithelegh, to grant  
Westminster. all lands which she holds in dower of the inheritance of Nicholas de  
Aldithelegh, her son, to her said son, charged with a yearly payment to her-  
self of 100*l.* for her sustenance. By K.
- Oct. 25. Licence, upon fine, for William de Cressy to grant, in fee, the manor of  
Westminster. Risegate, held in chief, to Hugh de Cressy, with remainders over failing  
issue to Robert de Cressy and to himself.
- Nov. 8. Pardon to Robert de Clyfford for acquiring in fee, without the late king's  
Westminster. licence, from Walter, bishop of Coventry and Lichfield, a third part of the  
manor of Staveleye, co. Derby, held in chief; and also for demising the  
same to John de Crumbwelle and Idonia his wife, for their lives. Pardon  
to them for acquiring the said third part of the manor, with restitution  
thereof.
- Sept. 15. Exemption, for life, for Master Richard Wauncy, parson of the church  
Westminster. of St. Nicholas, Guildford, co. Surrey, in respect of his dwelling-house  
in that town, from livery of the king's stewards, chamberlains and other  
ministers. By p.s.
- Nov. 24. Exemption, at the instance of Richard de Potesgrave, king's chaplain,  
Byfleet. parson of the church of Byfleet, for his father, John de Coblynton, from  
being placed on juries, assizes or recognisances. By p.s.
- Pardon to Andrew Sely, on account of his good service in Scotland to the  
late king, for the death of John Augustyn of Wy[n]chelse. [By p.s. 339.]
- Pardon to William Turk', on account of his good service in Scotland to  
the late king, for the death of John le Ismonger of Sandwich. [By p.s. 338.]
- Nov. 27. Licence for Hugh le Despenser to demise to John de Handlo, for the  
Westminster. life of the latter, the manor of Beckeley, co. Oxford, held in chief.
- Oct. 25. Licence for the abbot of St. Augustine, Canterbury, to crenellate a  
Westminster. chamber, which he is building without the gate of the abbey.  
By K., on the information of W. de Melton.
- Dec. 9. Indemnity for the abbot of Ramsey, upon payment to John Vanne and  
Dover. the merchants of the society of the Ballardis of Lucca of 200 marks due  
from him to Walter, bishop of Coventry and Lichfield, which sum the king,  
into whose hands the lands of the bishop have been taken, has assigned to  
the Ballardis in part discharge of his own indebtedness to them.
- The like to the prior and convent of Ely, upon payment to the Ballardis of  
a sum of 200 marks due to Walter, bishop of Coventry and Lichfield.
