July 8. Philip, prior of Longueville Giffard, staying beyond seas, has letters
Westminster. nominating William de Talia, his fellow-monk, and John de Seens his attorneys for two years.
- Protection, for two years, for Neapolio, [Cardinal of St. Andrew's,] prebendary of Suth Cave in the church of St. Peter, York, and of Sutton cum Bukyngham in the church of St. Mary, Lincoln. By K.
- Grant, for life, to Oliver de Burdegala, king's yeoman, of all lands and tenements in Eton, co. Buckingham, which the king held of the grant of Roger de Moubray of Scotland.
By K., on the information of Roger de Wyngefeld, king's clerk.
- July 8. Licence for the alienation in mortmain by William Colle of Worcester to
Westminster. the master and brethren of the hospital of St. Wulstan, Worcester, of a messuage, 30 acres of land and common of pasture for 6 oxen in the suburb of Worcester. *Per Cancellar' pro Deo.*
- The like, upon fine, for Roger Orger of Melton of 2 messuages, 2½ bovates and 3 acres of land and 2½ acres of meadow in Melton to a chaplain to celebrate divine service daily in the church of Melton.
- Safe-conduct, for one year, for William Fithian, king's mariner, with his ship called '*la Margarete*' of Waterford, in Ireland, sailing on a trading expedition to various ports.
By K., on the information of W. de Melton.
- Grant, for one year, to John de Warena, earl of Surrey, of the prise of falcons at Lenne and Iernemuthe. By p.s.
- 12 March, Remission of the farm due from Isabella de Bello Monte for the castle of
3 Edward II. Baumburgh with truncage, and of a rent in the town of Warnemuth.
Westminster. *Cancelled, being entered on the Roll for the third year.*
- July 8. Grant to Alice de Leygrave, formerly the king's nurse, of the custody of
Westminster. the lands of Alice, daughter of William de Gouniz, tenant in chief, during the minority of her son and heir, together with his marriage.
Mandate in pursuance to Walter de Gloucester, escheator on this side Trent.
- Pardon, at the instance of William Martyn, to William de Beaumund for breaking prison at Exeter. By K.
- Grant, for life, to John Page, in accordance with a grant, 5 January, 35 Edward I., to him as yeoman of the king's chamber, of the forestership of Derewentfelles. He is to receive a yearly fee of 46s. 8d. at the hands of the constable of the castle of Cokermuth. Grant to him so long as he holds the forestership of a messuage called '*Swynsete*' in Brigham.
- July 10. Protection, until Easter, for John de Hustwait, staying at Gascony on the
Windsor. king's service. By K.
- July 8. Richard Bagot, going beyond seas in the train of Robert son of Walter,
Westminster. has letters nominating Adam de Harwedon and William de Routon his attorneys until three years from Michaelmas.
