 July 22. Westminster. Licence to John de Middelton to crenellate his dwelling-house of Neu-
 lond, co. Northumberland. By K.
- Licence to Roger Mauduit to crenellate his dwelling-house of Esshete,
 co. Northumberland. By K.
- July 18. Protection, for two years, for Robert Tymparon, master of the hospital
 of St. Leonard, Cestrefeld.
- Pardon to David son of John le Leker of Whitchirche for the death of
 John Pref, as it appears by the record of Miles de Rodeberwe and Richard
 de Harleye, justices of gaol delivery for Shrewsbury, that he killed him
 through mischance.
- July 20. Presentation of Robert de Hemmyngburgh, upon the resignation of John
 de Hemmyngburgh, to a fourth part of the church of St. Mary, Antyng-
 ham, in the diocese of Nórwich.
- July 18. Westminster. Grant, during pleasure, to Thomas and Edmund, the king's brothers, for
 their sustenance, of all the castles, towns, manors and tenements in the
 king's hands late of Roger le Bygod, sometime earl of Norfolk and marshal
 of England. [*Fœdera.*]
- Appointment, at will, of John de Thorpe to be keeper of all castles, &c.
 granted, as above, for the maintenance of the king's brothers, to appoint
 and remove all bailiffs and servants, and to account at the wardrobe of the
 king's brothers for all issues thereof, the custody of the castle of Sturguil
 excepted, which had been granted, during pleasure, to Robert Darcy, king's
 clerk.
- Mandate in pursuance to the treasurer and barons of the Exchequer.
- July 18. Westminster. Licence, upon fine, to Joan, late the wife of William Lovel, to grant, in
 fee, to William de Perevile a messuage, 90 acres of land, 5 acres of wood,
 7 acres of meadow, 5 acres of pasture, 15s. 4d. of rent, and a fourth part
 of a water-mill in Springfield, held in chief.
- July 26. St. Albans. Pardon, upon fine, to Richard de Funteneye for acquiring, in fee, without
 licence, from John de Braddele 22 acres of land, 4 acres of meadow,
 5 acres of moor, and pasture for 8 oxen and 200 sheep in Braddele by
 Grymmesby and Little Cotes, held in chief; with restitution of the same.
- July 23. Windsor. Pardon, upon fine, to John Canun for acquiring in fee, without licence,
 from John de Braddele 12 acres of land and 4 acres of moor in Braddele
 by Grymmesby, held in chief; with restitution of the same.
- July 31. Northampton. Licence to William de Langeton, to whom the king has committed,
 during pleasure, the custody of the county of Kermerdyn, to appoint a
 deputy to execute his office, whenever he himself in obedience to the king's
 mandate shall pass without his bailiwick. By p.s.
- Aug. 1. Appointment, during pleasure, of Roger Hagemon, clerk, to the custody
 of the smaller piece of the seal for the recognisances of debts for the town
 of Shrewsbury.
- Appointment, during pleasure, of Robert Darcy to be keeper, in the
 name of Thomas and Edmund the king's brothers, of the castle of
 Struguyll, with the honor and lands thereof, assigned for their sustenance,
 rendering to them yearly the usual sum. By p.s. [1105.]
- Mandate in pursuance to Hugh le Despenser, constable of the castle.
- Pardon to John de Pateshulle for removing beasts and goods from
 the lands of Walter de Langeton, bishop of Coventry and Lichfield, after
 those lands were taken into the king's hands. By p.s.
