Further that the same Thomas de Ludelowe with Peter de Lumbardye, Simon de la Mare, William Pacy and William de Hemmyngby, with others, overturned at Scrivelby, co. Lincoln, his wagons carrying the tithes of sheaves so that the same were trampled under foot and consumed by divers animals, assaulted his men and servants accompanying the wagons, impounded his sheep, felled and carried away his trees, and killed his animals.
