 March 20. Grant, at the instance of Gilbert de Clare, earl of Gloucester and Hertford, to the abbess and convent of Canonleghe of lands or rents to the value of 100*l.* a year out of the custodies which shall first fall into the king's hands, until they shall be satisfied in the sum of 672*l.* 5*s.* 10½*d.*, advanced by them to the late king, as appeared by the testimony of David de Serynton, clerk to the abbess.  Mandate in pursuance to Roger de Wellesworthe, escheator beyond Trent.
- July 6. Protection, for one year, for Master John de Nassington, prebendary of Suth Neubald in the church of St. Peter, York.
- April 26. Exemption, for life, for William de Clife from being put on assizes, juries, or recognisances; and from being made sheriff, coroner, or other minister of the king. By p.s.
- July 4. Licence, upon fine, for the alienation in mortmain by John Noppe of Chadeleswyche to the master and brethren of the hospital of St. Wulfstan, Worcester, of a messuage and one-third part of a virgate of land in Chadeleswyche.

- May 28. Licence to Nicholas de Sancto Mauro to crenellate his dwelling-house of Eton Meysi, co. Wilts. By p.s.
- July 2. Appointment of John de Insula and Hugh de Louthre to audit the accounts of the murage granted, 2 December, 3 Edward II., to the bailiffs and good men of the town of Newcastle-on-Tyne, of which Gilbert le Flemynge, Nicholas son of John Scot and William de Oggil, burgesses of the town, were named collectors. - July 6. Commission to William de Vallibus and Gerard Salveyn to enquire touching forestalling within the county of York, as William le Vavasur,
