Sept 16. Grant, for life, to Robert son of Payn, of the manor of Kyngesbury with Westminster. the rent of assize of Molleburn and with the hundred of la Horethorne, co. Somerset, as the king has restored to Walter, bishop of Coventry and Lichfield, the manor of Norton Seint Walery, which he had granted, for life, to the said Robert with a promise that if he should deprive him of that manor to assign him other lands of equal value in compensation.
