- Oct. 21. Windsor. Commission *de walliis et fossatis* to Walter le Baud, William son of Robert, and John de Norton for the sea coast of the county of Essex, and also for the town of Wolewyche, co. Kent.
- Oct. 27. Westminster. Commission associating John Wogan with the steward and marshal of the household to deliver John de Redingges and Edmund de Malo Lacu, and to do them justice according to law and the custom of the king's Marshalsea. The former, who is a prisoner in the Marshalsea for counterfeiting the king's privy seal and for sealing letters therewith, when charged before the steward and marshal of the household in the court of the Marshalsea, asserted that he had received the seal from the said Edmund de Malo Lacu, late steward of the household.
- Oct. 28. Westminster. Commission of oyer and terminer to Hugh de Louthre and Robert de Barton, on complaint by John de Coupeland that Thomas de Hoton, John son of William son of Adam de Craystok, Thomas son of Michael, and John son of William Ketelsone, assaulted him at Laisingby, co. Cumberland, and carried away his goods. By fine of 20s.

- Oct. 12. Windsor. The like to William de Ormesby, John de Thorpe, and Edward Charles, touching the riotous conduct in the city of Norwich of John de Ingham, Roger Marche, William Marche and others, their confederates, who assault the citizens and men of that city, and also those who resort thither on business, nor suffer the citizens to leave their houses unless they make a fine for doing so, nor permit themselves to be brought to justice by the bailiffs of the city, but threaten the bailiffs with bodily harm if they attempt to execute their office, by reason of which treats the bailiffs fear to execute their office for preserving the peace of the city, and foreign merchants and others who were accustomed to resort to the city with their wares and other goods for sale have ceased to do so, to the impoverishment of the citizens and men of those parts. - Oct. 10. Windsor. The like to John de Neville of Stokes, William Marmyon and William de Spanneby, on complaint by Peter de Scorse, that William Moldesman of Tillesbyry, John de Rye and John Hillary, with others, assaulted him at Boston, co. - Oct. 15. Windsor. The like to John de Mutford and John de Pabenham, on information that when Geoffrey de la Lee, to whom the king has committed the custody of the lands of the Templars in the county of Hertford to hold at will, approached the town of Baldok, co.
