meadows, woods or groves, and tenants, and in all other things whatsoever, excepting feedings and pastures belonging to the portions of the vicarage as already expressed, shall belong to the chancellor and to his portion in future, excepting the tithes accruing from the lands, meadows and animals of the vicar, of which the chancellor shall not receive anything from the vicar, nor the vicar anything from those of the chancellor; the vicar and his successors shall henceforth maintain the books and ornaments, which from the beginning have been provided in sufficient manner out of the integral goods of the said church, and all other ordinary burthens, due and customary incumbent on the said church, except the entire new roofing of the chancel, and the rebuilding of the same, if it shall happen; *et onera extraordinaria pro tempore occurrencia si ultra unicum decimam se extendant agnoscent idem vicarius et sui successores pro quarta parte taxationis ecclesie supradicte.*
