June 24. Licence for Roger de Mortuo Mari of Wyggemore to grant to John de  
Westminster. Hothum and Philip ap Howel the castle and manor of Wyggemore, and land of Melenyth with the castles of Kenethles and Dynbaud in the same land, the land of Kedewyng with the castle of Dolvorayn, and the land of Comotoyder, held in chief, and the reversion of the castle and manor of Radenore, and land of Kery, and the castle of Knoklas, the manors of Knyghteton, Norton, Presthemede and Pullyth, the manor and land of Warthreynon and the castle of Rayder in the Marches of Wales, the manors of Kyngesleone and Nethewode, co. Hereford, Bewdley (*de Bello Loco*), co. Worcester, and Worthy, co. Southampton, and the third part of the manor of Aure, co. Gloucester, held in chief, on the death of Margaret, late the wife of Edmund de Mortuo Mari, who holds them for life of his inheritance; and for them to re-grant the same to him and the heirs of his body, with remainder, failing such issue, to Edmund his son and the heirs of his body, with final remainder over to the right heirs of the said Roger.
