- March 14.
Winchester. William, abbot of Ste. Katherine du Mont, Rouen, staying beyond the seas, has letters nominating Roger Hwyt[er] and Roger de Mortuo Mari, his attorneys for three years.
- March 10.
Clarendon. Presentation of Master William de Fakenham to the church of Jaggeleye, in the diocese of Chichester, void by the resignation of John le Girdelere, the late rector thereof, in the king's gift by reason of his custody of the land and heir of Giles de Plaiz, deceased, tenant in chief of the late king.
- March 14.
Winchester. Licence to William de Newport, to act as sub-sheriff for Essex, from which office he was removed by the barons of the Exchequer, before whom he was, at the suit of Master Richard de Gravesende, treasurer of St. Paul's, London, convicted, condemned to prison, and prohibited henceforth from meddling with any office belonging to the king, for certain excesses and trespasses alleged to have been committed by him under colour of his office, satisfaction having been made by him as well to the king as to the said Master Richard. - March 16.
Winchester. Safe conduct, until Michaelmas, for Franciscus Mordechastellis, merchant, going beyond the seas on business of the king
- March 16.
Clarendon. Presentation of Thomas de Teffonte to the church of Wytteneye, in the diocese of Lincoln, in the king's gift by reason of the late voidance of the bishopric of Winchester. By K.
- March 16.
Broughton. Grant to the prior and canons of Ivychurch of pasture for 40 oxen and cows within the king's park of Clarendon. By p.s.
- March 14.
Winchester. Grant, for six years, to Edmund de Kendale, going on pilgrimage to the Holy Land, in aid of his sustenance on the pilgrimage, that he may hold the manor of Lyndon, co. Rutland, quit of the yearly rent of 6*l.* 6*s.* 6½*d.* at the Exchequer, subject to which the king had lately granted him the said manor to hold during pleasure; and licence for him to demise the manor to whomsoever he will for that time. - March 20.
Clarendon. Grant to Hugh le Despenser the elder, in part satisfaction of certain debts due to him from the king, and in recompence for 180*l.*, of the custody of the manor of Polton by Crekkelade, co. Wilts, late of Nicholas de Sancto Mauro, deceased, tenant in chief, in the king's hands by reason of the minority of Thomas, his son and heir, who was of the age of twelve and a quarter years on 5 February last past, which is extended at 12*l.* 11*s.* a year, as appears by inquisitions made by Master John Walewayn, escheator on this side Trent, to hold to the value of 20*l.* a year, to the full age of the heir, or for the same time should the heir die during minority, the next heir being a minor. If the said Hugh be removed before such time, due recompence shall be made to him.
Mandate in pursuance to the escheator.
- March 20.
Clarendon. Licence for the alienation in mortmain to Walter, archbishop of Canterbury, by Master John de Rodeswell, of 8 acres of land, 1½ acres of meadow, and 2 acres of wood in Sevenhok adjoining the archbishop's park of Otteford, for the enlargement thereof.
Safe conduct, until Michaelmas, for Nicholas de Wysebech, of the Order of Preachers, going to the Court of Rome on business of the king.
- March 16.
Mottisfont. Grant to the prior and convent of St. Swithun's, Winchester, that the grant for life, which they made at the king's request, to John de Nantoill, king's yeoman, and usher of queen Isabella, of 20*l.* a year to be received out of their house for the sustenance of himself and two grooms and two horses, shall not be to their prejudice in the future, or taken as a precedent.
