Sept. 25.
York. Licence for the alienation in mortmain by Richard de Horsleye of a messuage, 100 acres of land, 6 acres of meadow, and 20s. of rent in Lynsheles, and Alwenton to a chaplain to celebrate divine service daily in the chapel of St. Nicholas in his manor of Aldensheles for his soul and the souls of his ancestors and all Christians. By K.
- Sept. 28.
York. Grant during pleasure to Robert de Insula of Chepchesse, in aid of his sustenance, of 20 marks a year to be received at Whitsuntide out of the custom of wool, hides, and wool-fells in the port of Newcastle-upon-Tyne. By p.s.
- Sept. 26.
York. Grant during pleasure to Robert de Reymes, in aid of his sustenance, of 10*l.* a year to be received at Whitsuntide out of the custom of wool, hides, and wool-fells in the port of Newcastle-upon-Tyne. By p.s.
- Sept. 28.
York. Appointment, until All Saints Day, of Gilbert de Risshton and Thomas de Neubigging to purvey for the king's use 100 quarters of wheat, 100 quarters of malt, and 100 quarters of beans in the parts of Holderness. By K. on the information of the Steward.
- Sept. 27.
York. Grant to Giles de Ispania, king's yeoman, of the houses at La Forde without London, which the king holds of the gift of Walter, archbishop of Canterbury, to hold to him and the heirs of his body, with reversion failing issue to the king. By p.s.
- Sept. 30.
York. Writ of aid for Roger Catur, master of the ship called '*la Blithe*' of Westminster to select 40 able seamen (*marinarios sufficientes et defensabiles*) to man his ship with. By K.
- The like for the undermentioned masters, viz.—
Henry de Newehithe, master of the ship called '*la Godyere*' of Westminster.
Richard atte Wose, master of the ship called the '*St. Leonard*' of Westminster.
- Writ of aid for John de Leycestre, serjeant at arms, whom the king has appointed to select seamen to man the ships, the *St. Leonard* of Westminster, *la Godyer* of Westminster and *la Blithe* of Westminster, viz. 40 able seamen for each.
- Grant to Nicholas Isambardi de Longa Villa of the prebend of Apesthorne in the church of St. Peter, York, in the king's gift by reason of the voidance of the archbishopric of York. By K.
- Mandate in pursuance for the same Isambard to the dean and chapter of York.
- Vacated because surrendered and cancelled, and otherwise below for another.*
- Sept. 30.
York. The king, having lately granted during pleasure the custody of the castle and manor of Malton to John de Moubray, to whom he commanded Robert de Sapy, escheator on this side Trent to deliver the same, and being informed that certain ill-disposed persons occupy the castle and do not permit delivery of seisin thereof, commands the sheriff of York to take with him, if necessary, the entire *posse* of his county and in person to approach the castle and manor and to cause all such evil disposed persons to be removed: further he is without delay to deliver the castle and manor to John de Moubray. - Sept. 28.
York. Grant during pleasure to the nuns of Ermynthwayt, co. Cumberland, on whom much loss has been inflicted by the king's Scotch enemies, in relief of the state of their house of sufficient pasture for their beasts in the forest of Inglewode. By p.s.
