- Nov. 23. Mandate to the chamberlain of Kaermerdyn to pay, out of the aid

- Nov. 22. Mandate to the chamberlain of Kaernarvan to pay, out of the aid granted  
York. by the knights and others of North Wales for the war in Scotland, to Roger  
de Mortuo Mari of Wyggemor 2000 marks, in part payment of the sum of  
money, in which the king is bound to him for staying on his service, as his

- Nov. 20. Appointment, during pleasure, of Adam de Fyncham, king's clerk, to  
York. follow and defend the king's business before the justices of the King's

- Nov. 27. Notification to L. bishop of Durham of the revocation for divers causes

- Nov. 16. Licence for the alienation in mortmain by John Cusyn of Norwich of a

chaplains to celebrate divine service daily for the soul of the grantor and  
the souls of his father, mother, ancestors and all Christians.
