March 4. William le Jeu of Coker, going to Gascony to remain there on the king's  
York. service in the company of William de Monte Acuto, seneschal of Gascony, has letters nominating Walter de Enemere his attorney for one year.

March 5. Simple protection for the same William le Jeu for one year.  
York. By K. on the testimony of W. de Monte Acuto.

March 6. Grant to the Friars Minors of Oxford, who had acquired all that area,  
York. formerly of the Friars of the Penance of Oxford, in the suburb of Oxford adjacent to their own area, and which they surrendered to the king as fully as it came into their hands, that they may hold in frank almain the said area, so surrendered, to them and their successors, dwelling in Oxford, for the enlargement of their own area. By K.

March 5. Exemption for life for John de Lokcombe from being put on assizes,  
York. juries or recognitions; and from being made sheriff, coroner, verderer, or other bailiff or minister of the king. By K.

March 6. Grant during pleasure to Richard de Werdale of the bailiwick of the  
York. forestership of the forest of Castle Bernard, in the king's hands by reason of the minority of the heir of Guy de Bello Campo, earl of Warwick, tenant in chief, to hold in the same manner as John Tuyng held it. By p.s.  
Mandate in pursuance to Henry son of Hugh, constable of the said castle to deliver him the bailiwick with such wages as the said John received.

March 7. Roger de Heselarton, parson of the church of Quixlay, going beyond the  
York. seas, has letters nominating Robert de Goldesburgh and Ralph de Caton his attorneys for one year. By K.

March 5. Confirmation to the prior, canons, and brethren of the Temple dwelling at  
York. Northferiby of the under-mentioned grants of parcels of land to God and the Holy Temple, and the canons and brethren thereof dwelling at Northferiby, viz. by John de Farnham, clerk, of land in Austmersk and Swanneslund; by Ralph son of John de Ycumbia of Feriby of his right in the land, late of John his father in Feriby; by Richard de Vescy, clerk, of his right in the toft which he bought from Ralph son of John de Ycumbe; by Alan son of Brian, sometime chaplain of Feriby, of his right in a toft in Northferiby; by William de Heselrig son of Alan of land in Alvesle; by Gerard son of Gerard de Furnivall of land called 'le Park' and other lands in Northferibi; by Ralph le Gros (*Crassus*) of Northferiby of land in Elvelay; by Hubert son of Robert the Little (*Parvi*) of his right in land in Swanneslund; by Geoffrey Boulur of Swanneslund of his right in land in the same place;
