Gloucester. Remission to Cicely daughter of Thomas de Parys of Westbury of the sentence passed upon her. She had been sentenced to be hanged by Richard de Solariis and his fellows, justices of the late king of gaol delivery for the castle of Gloucester, for breaking the church of Westbury and the theft of wax from the said church, and also for receiving Stephen son of Thomas de Parys and John his brother, but being pregnant she had been reprieved. Gloucester. Simple protection without clause for three years for Thomas de Aune, going with Ralph de Gorges, the elder, to Ireland on the king's service. By K.

Gloucester. Safe-conduct, at the request of Philip, king of France and Navarre, made by Aymer de Valencia, earl of Pembroke, for merchants and men of the town of Amiens coming into the realm with wares to trade, with exemption until All Saints of their goods from arrest for any debts in which the king of France may be bound to merchants of the realm ; provided the said king shall by the earl of Pembroke cause satisfaction to be made before that date to merchants of the realm for the debts he owes them, and that he will not ask for further delay for the said debts. By K.
- April 4.  
St. Briavels. John, prior of Lanthony Prima in Wales, staying in England, has letters nominating William Skiry and David le Walssh his attorneys in Ireland for two years.
- April 8.  
Gloucester. Presentation of Philip de Lawhadeyn to the church of Lamberteston, in the diocese of St. Davids, in the king's gift by reason of the late voidance of the priory of Haverford.
- April 3.  
St. Briavels. Writ *de intendendo*, directed to the knights and others of the liberty of Irchenfeld in the Marches of Wales, for Henry de Pembrugge, king's yeoman, keeper of the liberty, appointed to array the men thereof. By p.s.
- April 11.  
Gloucester. Pardon to Juliana de Leyburne of the 100*l.* in which she is bound to the king of her forfeited issues, and which are demanded by summons of the Exchequer. By p.s.
