Jan. 28. Shrewsbury. Appointment of Reginald de Abenhale, Walter de Nasse, John de la Box, William de Hathewy, Richard Malemort, and Richard de Irby to seize into the king's hands the castle of St. Briavels, lately taken by the contrariants, and to keep it safe, and also they are to arrest and imprison the said contrariants until further order. By K.  
Writ of aid for them directed to the barons, knights and others in the forest of Dene and other parts of the county of Gloucester. By K.
- Jan. 20. Shrewsbury. Simple protection without clause for the prior of Tykeford.
- Jan. 20. Shrewsbury. Protection during pleasure for the chancellor, and masters of the university of Oxford and all persons studying there. By K.
- Jan. 22. Shrewsbury. Licence for Robert Lewer, king's yeoman, to crenellate his dwelling place of Westbury, co. Southampton. By p.s.  
Protection with clause *nolumus* for one year for Roger de la Mare; nothing is to be taken for the king's use from his corn, hay, horses, carts, carriages (*cariagiis*), victuals or other goods in his manors of Millynghope, Hungerford, Thoggelond, Hulton, Possethorn, Armegrave, Wytanestowe and Feldhampton; or from the goods of his tenants therein. By K.
- Feb. 7. Gloucester. The like for two years for the dean and chapter of St. Paul's, London, in their manors of Walton, Kirkeby, Thorp', Brightlingeseye, Beauchamp Canouns, Wykham, Hebrege, Tylingham, Barelyngges, Westlee, Ronewell, Northon, Navestok, Chingelford, Pelham Forneux, Pelham Arsa, Aldebury, Sandon, Erdeleye, Cadynton, Dratton, Sutton, Bernes, Willesdon, St. Pancras, Hamersmyth, Yeveneye, Sonnebury and Boyton. By K.
- Feb. 15. Gloucester. The like for one year for William de Lodelowe, parson of the church of Suckeleye. By K.
- Jan. 23. Shrewsbury. Protection, until Michaelmas, for the servants whom John de Wellesleye, staying in England on the king's service, is sending to Ireland to purvey 200 quarters of corn for the maintenance of himself and his household. By K.
- Jan. 8. Worcester. Grant, at the instance of Gilbert, abbot of Bec Herlewin, staying beyond the seas, and of the convent of that place, that William de Ponte Episcopi, his fellow monk, their proctor general in England, be admitted as attorney of the abbot with power to appoint attorneys in his place.
- Jan. 23. Shrewsbury. Pardon to William son of Ralph le Mareschal and John his brother, who were convicted of an assault on William Rosce of Totynebek, of their outlawry in the county of Sussex for not appearing before the king to satisfy him for that which belongs to him for the said trespass; provided that they surrender and satisfy the king of what belongs to him for the said trespass and the said William of the damages adjudged to him.

- Jan. 25. Ludlow. The like, at the instance of Robert de Kendale, to Alexander de Bernefeld of that which pertains to the king for his trespass against the abbot of Grestain, whereof the said Alexander was convicted, and of any consequent outlawry; provided he surrender to gaol in the county of Sussex, and satisfy the said abbot. - Jan. 27. Ludlow. Appointment of John de Felton, Stephen le Blount, and John de Weston juxta Brewode to survey all the manors, lands, woods, parks, &c. and goods belonging to the bishopric of Coventry and Lichfield, void, and in the king's hands, so that waste or injury be not done to them so
