July 10.  
York. Exemption to John de Barton of Fryton, who by the king's mandate is attendant to the affairs of Alice de Lascy, countess of Lincoln and Salisbury, the king's kinswoman, from being compelled whilst he is so engaged, to go on the king's service to Scotland or elsewhere. By K.
- July 10.  
York. Licence for the alienation in mortmain by Alice de Lacy, countess of Lincoln and Salisbury, to the abbot and convent of Barlynges of the manor of Swaveton, co. Lincoln, and of the advowson of the church of that manor, which are held in chief, to hold in frank almoin; licence also for the abbot and convent to appropriate the said church. By K.
- Protection for life with clause *nolumus* for Thomas, abbot of Barlynges, his men and lands. By K. on the information of William de Clif.
- July 14.  
York. Safe-conduct, until Christmas, for Richard de Burgo, earl of Ulster, and William de Burgo, coming to the king on the king's affairs, their men and households. By K.
- July 12.  
York. Simple protection without clause for one year for William Lengigneour.
- July 14.  
York. Protection with clause *nolumus* for one year for William de Hoton of Roston, serjeant of Richard de Ayremynne, parson of the church of Elvelay.
- July 13.  
York. Safe-conduct for one year for merchants of Spain, coming within the realm with wares to trade, provided they pay the usual customs. By K. on the information of Master R. de Baldok.
- July 14.  
York. Licence for John de Denum and Margaret his wife to enfeoff Master William de Middelton, clerk, of the manors of Wygeton, Kirkebride, and Melmorby and of the advowsons of the churches thereof, and the manors of Great Waverton, Ulveton, Dundrawe and Staynton, co. Cumberland, held in chief, and for him to re-grant the same to them in tail with remainder failing such issue to the right heirs of Margaret. By K.
- Presentation of John de Ros, to the church of Scoreburgh in the diocese of York in the king's gift as before set forth. The letters of presentation are directed to the provost of the church of St. John, Beverley.
- July 16. Grant to the bailiffs and good men of the town of Kyngeston upon Thames that their grant of four footmen armed with haketons, habergeons, and basinets and iron gloves, to remain on the king's service in the Scotch war at their expense for a certain time, shall not be to their prejudice or be drawn into a precedent. By K.
- July 11.  
York. Pardon to Thomas Lovel, late a rebel, with restitution of his lands and tenements forfeited on that account. By K.
- July 11.  
York. The like to John de Myners. By K. on the information of W. de Ayremynne.
- July 14.  
York. Licence for Fulk Lestraunge to crenellate his dwelling-place of Whitecherche, co. Salop. By p.s.
- July 15.  
York. Licence for the alienation in mortmain by William de Bourne to the prior and brethren of the hospital of St. John the Baptist, Bristol, of a messuage and a virgate of land in Dundray by Cheu. By fine of 40s.
- July 20.  
York. Geoffrey, abbot of St. Mary's, St. Pierre sur Dives, staying beyond the seas, has letters nominating John de Sancto Albano, his fellow-monk, and Guy Breton his attorneys in England for four years. By fine of 40s. Warwick.
