 Thomas de Burgo, king's clerk, escheator on this side Trent, in part  
 satisfaction of their licence to acquire lands and rents to the value of 20l.  
 a year.

 York. Presentation of Nicholas de Wedergrave, the younger, to the church of  
 Maperton in the diocese of Bath and Wells, void by the resignation of  
 Nicholas de Wavyngton, the last rector, and in the king's gift by reason of  
 his custody of the land and heir of Roger de Moeles, tenant in chief.
