March 15. *Inspeimus* and confirmation, in favour of Hugh le Despenser, earl of Westminster. Winchester, the present lord of the town and land of Dynebegh, of letters patent dated at Northampton, 28 August 18 Edward I, whereby the late king granted to Henry de Lascy, late earl of Lincoln, that all his men then or thereafter inhabiting his town of Dinebegh should be exempt throughout all the king's lands of Wales, and also the counties of Chester, Stafford, Salop, Gloucester, Worcester and Hereford from toll, stallage, paiage, pavage, murage, pontage and passage. March 5. Simple protection until Michaelmas for Walter Waldeshef, king's yeoman, Westminster. going on pilgrimage beyond the seas. By p.s.

March 3. Exemption for life to Richard le Chaumberleyn, knight, from being put Westminster. on assizes, juries or recognitions, and from being made sheriff, coroner, forester, verderer or other bailiff of the king against his will. By K.

March 10. Mandate to John de Blomvull, escheator in the counties of Norfolk, Westminster. Suffolk, Cambridge, Huntingdon, Essex and Hertford, to restore the temporalities of the priory of Eye to Robert Morpayn, monk of Bernay, preferred to be prior thereof by Robert, abbot of Bernay, the king having taken his fealty. By K.  
Writ *de intendendo* directed to the tenants.

March 7. Licence for the alienation in mortmain to the abbot and convent of Westminster. Langedon by Henry Beaufiz of 100 acres of land, 4*s.* 9*d.* of rent and a rent of 11 hens in Westlangedon, not held in chief, which are extended at 30*s.* 11*d.* a year, as appears by inquisition made by the sheriff of Kent; in part satisfaction of their licence to acquire land and rent to the value of 20*l.* a year.

March 10. Richard de Clifford, canon of Raveneston, bringing news of the death of Westminster. Roger, the prior, has letters to the subprior and convent of licence to elect.

March 8. Protection with clause *volumus* for three years for John Darcy, 'le neveu,' Westminster. staying in Ireland on the king's service. By K.
