- by the sheriffs of the city, to the dean and chapter of St. Paul's, London, to maintain a chaplain to celebrate divine service daily in the said church for the good estate of the said Roger, for the souls of Anthony Beek, sometime patriarch of Jerusalem and bishop of Durham, and of the ancestors, relations, friends and benefactors of the said Roger and all the faithful departed, and for the soul of the said Roger after his death; also to provide certain feedings (*puturas*) for the poor, and other alms yearly: in part satisfaction of the said 12*l.*
- Sept. 33 (*sic*) Westminster. Respite until Easter for Ralph de Marchynton, from taking the arms of a knight. [*Parl. Writs.*] By K.
- Sept. 24. Westminster. Pardon to Geoffrey Seman of Cauntebrigg', for acquiring in fee from John de Chavent the manor of Wapham, held in chief, and entering therein without licence, and restitution to him of the manor. By fine of 20*l.* Sussex.
- Sept. 25. Tower of London. Licence for the alienation in mortmain by Master Henry de Clyf, king's clerk, to the prior and convent of St. Gregory, Canterbury, of 18 acres of land in Natinden by Canterbury, in aid of the maintenance of a chaplain to celebrate divine service daily in their conventual church for the soul of the said Henry and the souls of his ancestors and the faithful departed. By fine of $\frac{1}{2}$ mark.
- Sept. 25. Tower of London. Respite, until Easter, to Nicholas Russel from taking the arms of a knight. [*Parl. Writs.*] By p.s.
- Sept. 28. Tower of London. Grant to Lawrence de Insula, king's clerk, of the prebend of Cunqyn, in the church of Killaloe. By K.
Mandate in pursuance to D. bishop of Killaloe.
- Oct. 2. Westminster. Appointment, during pleasure, of William de Broclesby, king's clerk, as one of the remembrancers of the Exchequer. [*Parl. Writs.*] By K.
- Oct. 1. Acton. Presentation, on the nomination of S. bishop of London, of Sewal Scharp, chaplain, to the vicarage of the church of White Nottele, in the diocese of London, in the king's gift by reason of the priory of Thetford being in his hands.

- Sept. 26. Tower of London. Appointment of Stephen de Abyndon, constable of the castle of Pleshey, to levy all the fencible men of Essex for the defence of those parts against invaders. By K.
- Sept. 26. Tower of London. Mandate to John Darcy, justiciary of Ireland, to restore the temporalities of the bishopric of Killaloe, void by the death of Benedict, to David de Imlaco, preferred to be bishop thereof by J. the pope, the said David having renounced all words in the papal bull prejudicial to the king's right, and submitted himself to the king's grace herein. By K.
Writ *de intendendo* directed to the tenants.
- Sept. 26. Tower of London. Commission, during pleasure, to Stephen de Abyndon of the custody of the *corpus* of the castle of Pleshey, which is in the king's hands. By K.
Mandate in pursuance to John de Insula to deliver it.
- Sept. 28. Tower of London. Grant to the mayor, sheriffs and others of the city of London of murage for three years, to be taken by the hands of Hamo de Chiggewell, the mayor, and his deputies; on condition that goods passing over or under London Bridge, on which pontage is taken, pay nothing by reason of this custom.
