- March 4. Power for the abbot of Rivaulx and Ivo de Aldeburgh to treat for peace
Westminster. with Robert de Brus. [*Fœdera.*] By K. & C.
- March 4. The like for them to swear to a truce. [*Fœdera.*] By K. & C.
Westminster.
- March 6. *Inspeximus* and confirmation of letters patent dated 30 May, 16 Edward II.,
Westminster. being a truce with the Scots. *French.* [*Fœdera.*]
- March 10. Grant, at the request of Thomas Wake, to John Irp of Ipswich of the
Westminster. office of controller of customs in the port of Ipswich, with the custody of
one part of the king's seal called 'coket,' during pleasure. By p.s.
- Feb. 13. Grant for life to Roger de Swynnerton, for service to queen Isabella and
Westminster. the king, and for his better maintenance in the king's service, of the lands
in the counties of Stafford and Cheshire late of Hugh le Despenser, earl of
Winchester, which escheated to the king by forfeiture, without rendering
account for the issues, as required by the previous grant to him of the
custody thereof, dated 11 February. By p.s.
- March 11. Appointment of John de Crombwell, for service to queen Isabella and
Westminster. the king, to the custody of the Tower of London for the next five years.
By p.s.
- Mandate to Thomas de Wake to deliver to the said John, by indenture,
the Tower, with the armour, victuals, and other things belonging to the
king, and the prisoners therein. By the same.
- March 10. Appointment of Alexander le Peyntour of Wyndesore as one of the sur-
Westminster. veyors of works in Wyndesore Castle. By pet. of C.
- March 12. Master John Went, canon of the cathedral church of Cork, and William
Westminster. de Netilton, vicar of the church of the island of Inys McNeyll, bringing
news of the death of Philip, their late bishop, have letters to the dean and
chapter of the said church of licence to elect.
- March 8. Hugh de Brom, canon of Bokenham, bringing news of the death of
Westminster. John de Malton, late prior, has letters to the sub-prior and convent of
licence to elect.
- March 11. Licence for the abbess and convent of Marham to appropriate the
Westminster. church of Hakford, in the diocese of Norwich, which is of their advowson.

- March 15. Protection, with clause *nolumus*, for one year, for his property at
Westminster. Tamworth, for Master Henry de Clif, who is daily employed in the king's
business.
- March 10. Licence for Alice, late the wife of Walter de Welles, of the county of
Westminster. Essex, tenant in chief, to marry whom she will of the king's allegiance.
By fine of 2 marks.
- March 10. Grant to Duncan Makdowel of the marriage of Thomas de Malton,
Westminster. kinsman and heir of Henry de Malton, tenant in chief.
By bill of treasurer, and the fine is enrolled in the Exchequer.
Vacated by surrender.
- March 5. Confirmation of a licence by the late king for the burgesses of Kingston-
Westminster. upon-Hull to strengthen their town with moats and a wall and to crenellate
the wall; with further licence for them to crenellate their houses with
stone or tile. By K. & C.
- March 3. Pardon to the master of the hospital of St. John the Baptist, Brugge-
Westminster. wa'er, for acquiring from Richard de Wyggebere, land in Chilton and the
advowson of the church there, with the chapels of Ichestoke and Hun-
stighelle annexed thereto, held in chief, and for entering thereon without
licence; and licence for him to retain the same in mortmain.
