- March 13. Westminster. Licence, at the request of Thomas Wake, the king's kinsman, to Agnes late the wife of Nicholas de Greye, tenant in chief, to marry whom she will of the king's allegiance. By p.s.
- March 24. Westminster. Safe-conduct for one year for John Gabriel of Winchester, merchant, and his men.
- March 10. Westminster. Pardon to William de Kemesyng for adherence to Gilbert de Middelton, traitor to the late king, and to the Scots. By p.s.
- March 13. Westminster. Confirmation of letters patent of the late king to A. bishop of Hereford, sealed with the privy seal used by the present king while guardian of the realm in his father's absence, granting to the said bishop custody of the lands late of Gilbert de Stapilton, deceased, which came to the hands of the late king by grant of Mary de Sancto Paulo, countess of Pembroke, executrix of Aymer de Valencia, late earl of Pembroke, for certain debts wherein the earl was bound to the king at the day of his death, and which lands were in the earl's hands by reason of the minority of John, son and heir of the aforesaid Gilbert, who held of the earl by knight service; to hold during minority of the heir, with the marriage of the heir. - March 12. Westminster. Grant, at the request of A. bishop of Hereford, treasurer, to the bailiffs and men of the city of Hereford, of pavage for seven years. By p.s.
- March 10. Westminster. Grant to Michael de Presfen of the office of tronage of wools in the town of Newcastle-upon-Tyne, and of controller of the customs of wools, hides and wool-fells in the port of that town, during pleasure. By p.s.
- March 16. Westminster. Grant to the bailiffs and men of the town of Kyngeston-upon-Hull, of pavage for three years. By pet. of C.
- March 1. Westminster. Safe-conduct for John de Weston, constable of Bordeaux, and others, going on the king's business to the duchy [of Aquitaine].
- March 6. Westminster. Grant to John Devereus, king's yeoman, of the bailiwick of the chace of Cors, co. Gloucester, during pleasure. By p.s.
- March 12. Westminster. Pardon to John Spryngold for abjuring the realm at the church of Great Badewe, in the late king's reign; with general pardon. By p.s.

- March 6. Westminster. Pardon and restoration to the royal favour of Thomas de Sibthorp, king's clerk, suspected by queen Isabella and the king, before he assumed the governance of the realm, of adherence to Hugh le Despenser the younger, and Master Robert de Baldok, rebels; he having so acted since as to remove the suspicion. By p.s.
- March 12. Westminster. Remission to John Bullok, John de Doddeworth, Richard de Basevill, Godfrey de Stainton, and the prior of Mounkebretton of 260*l.*, the residue of a sum of 900*l.*, the value of goods forfeited to the late king and in his seisin, for the carrying off whereof they were indicted before Gilbert de Herle and Geoffrey le Scrop, justices of oyer and terminer in Yorkshire. Of this sum the late king remitted 600*l.*, and ordered the payment of the remainder by yearly instalments of 20*l.*, whereof 40*l.* has been paid. The present remission is in consequence of the petition of the said prior and convent, and pursuant to the statute that executors of those who were of the quarrel of Thomas, late earl of Lancaster, should have recovery of the testators' forfeited goods.
