in fee simple, and to the sub-tenants in his lands and fees in the cantreds of Ros and Rynonyawt and the commot of Kymmerch, English as well as Welsh, the right to chase, seize and carry off the deer and beasts of the wood (*feras et bestias silvestres*) in the lands aforesaid, excepting certain manors, woods, pastures and wastes, which rights, etc. they complain they have been prevented from enjoying by Hugh le Despenser, late earl of Winchester, although they enjoyed them in the time of the said earl of Lincoln and of Thomas, earl of Lancaster, afterwards their lord, at whose death the lands aforesaid came into the hands of the said Hugh, and by his forfeiture into the king's hands. The commissioners are to enquire in the presence of the king's keeper of these lands, by jury of the counties (*comitatum*) of Englefeld and Snaudon' and of the adjacent lands of Eycreutyn and Dynmael, whether the tenants have enjoyed the rights claimed and have been prevented as aforesaid, and they are to do justice to the tenants therein. The sheriffs of the counties aforesaid and Griffin, lord of Dynmael, have been commanded to let their men appear before the commissioners. *Alias fuit consignatum* by pet. of C. in the late reign.

Suffolk.

Commission to John de Cantebrigg', Robert de Kellesey and Robert de Asshele, on petition to the king and council in Parliament by the citizens of London and others who come to the city with their merchandise over the Thames, complaining that divers men of the counties of Middlesex, Surrey, Berks and Oxford have kidels along the banks of the river between London and Oxford, have made weirs in the same river, and fixed pales and piles along its course, and tied the cords of their nets athwart the stream, to the obstruction of ships and boats, contrary to divers charters of the citizens, and more especially to Magna Carta,—to enquire by jury of those counties as to the premises, with power to remove the said kidels, etc., and to punish offenders by fine and otherwise. *By pet. of C.*
