Commission to John de Heselarton, John de Hothum, the elder, and William de Saltford to enquire by jury of the county of York into the complaint of men and tenants of the East Riding that wool merchants from York, Beverley, Pokelyngtoun, Hull', Scardeburgh, Killum, Malton', and other towns of the East Riding, confederate, by writings and oaths, for the purpose of reducing the price of wool, not to buy it at more than the price agreed upon among themselves.

Commission to Robert de Aston' and Robert de Prestbury to enquire into breaches of the peace in the county of Gloucester, to arrest offenders, and to certify the king from time to time as to their names. By K.

Commission of oyer and terminer to Bartholemew de Burghersshe, constable of Dover Castle and warden of the Cinque Ports, Robert de Kendale, John de Cantebrigg' and Thomas de Faversham, on complaint by John Hasard, Thomas le Veel, Alfred de Pothiron and John Jacob, merchants of Dynaunt in Almain, that after proclamation of the late king permitting merchants to come into the kingdom with their wares, they had come to Waterford in Ireland, and there laden a vessel of Henry Godale of Hamelok with wools, hides and other merchandise for Bruges in Flanders, when Alexander le Keu of Wynchelse, Thomas de London', Benedict Sely of Wynchelse, John Badyn of Wynchelse, Peter Daulard of Sandwich, John Mois and John Pikeryng of Sandwich, in a great ship, met the said Henry's vessel at sea near the Isle of Wight, boarded her, and took forty-two sacks of wool, twelve dickers of hides, three pipes of salmon, two pipes of cheese, a bale (*trusslleum*) of cloth, silver plate, mazer cups (*ciphos de mazer*), one tiercelet, four sparrowhawks, and jewels and goods, value 600*l.*, and brought them to the Downs by Sandwich, and there did as they pleased with them; also that they compelled them to sign a letter of acquittance to the effect that they sought nothing from them in respect of those goods thus seized, and that they put them aboard a boat called *Skoute* and sent them into Flanders, not permitting them to land in England. This commission is issued out of consideration to the late king's proclamation, and at the request of the duke of Brabant, the king's kinsman, and lady Margaret, his mother, and the borough and magistrates of the towns of Bruges, Liege and Dynaunt, who have urgently petitioned the late king for restitution.
