Aug. 12.  
York. Grant, at the instance of John de Wysham, steward of the household, to the bailiffs and good men of Worcester of pontage for three years, to be taken by John Lony, the younger, and William de Martloye, citizens of Worcester. By p.s.
- Aug. 15.  
York. Grant to Robert de Wyvill', king's clerk, of the prebend in the collegiate church of Wyngham, lately held by Thomas de Upton, in the king's gift by reason of the voidance of the see of Canterbury. By p.s.  
Mandate in pursuance to the provost and chapter of Wyngham.
- Aug. 15.  
York. Presentation of Robert de Wyvill to the church of Maydenstan, in the diocese of Canterbury, in the king's gift by reason of the voidance of that see. By p.s.
- Aug. 16.  
York. Grant to the abbot and convent of St. Mary, York, of all the venison in the forest of Spaunton in Blakhommere between the rivers Donne and Syvene, for five years (saving to the king the profits (*adventibus*) of the keepers of the forest and the forfeitures of trespassers in venison), in exchange for the tithe of venison in the forest of Galtres granted to them by charters of the king's progenitors. Galtres Forest is extremely burdened by the frequent huntings therein for the king and others by his licence, and by seizure of the said tithe. The said abbot has the custody of Spaunton Forest, wherein the king has no covert or demesne land or aught but venison of hart and hind. It has been found by inquisition *ad quod damnum* of John de Crombewell, keeper of the forest this side Trent, not prejudicial but for the king's advantage to make this grant, and that Spaunton Forest is too confined, with no frequent repair of deer, except at times (*per vices*) of hart and hind, which lightly return beyond the forest. Pontefract. Appointment of Henry de Thrapston', king's clerk, as second baron of the Exchequer in Dublin, during pleasure. By K. & C.  
Mandate in pursuance to the treasurer and barons there.
- Aug. 21.  
Pontefract. Appointment, during pleasure, of John Darcy 'le Neveu' to the office of justiciary of Ireland, and to keep the country with 19 other men-at-arms, with the yearly fee of 500*l.* By K. & C.  
Mandate in pursuance to Roger Utlagh, prior of the Hospital of St. John of Jerusalem in Ireland.  
Writ *de intendendo* in pursuance to archbishops, bishops and others.  
The like to all bailiffs and subjects of the king in Ireland.
- Aug. 22.  
Pontefract. Appointment of Nicholas Fastolf as chief justice for holding pleas following the justiciary of Ireland, during pleasure. By K. & C.  
Mandate in pursuance to John Darcy 'le Neveu.'
- Aug. 22.  
Pontefract. Appointment of Roger de Preston second justice for holding pleas following the justiciary of Ireland, during pleasure. By K. & C.  
Mandate in pursuance to Nicholas Fastolf.
- Aug. 21.  
Pontefract. Appointment of William de Boseworth, king's clerk, to the custody of the writs and rolls in Ireland, for pleas before the chief justice, during pleasure. By K. & C.  
Mandate in pursuance to John Darcy 'le Neveu.'
- Aug. 21.  
Pontefract. Grant to Nicholas Fastolf, for his service in Ireland to the late and present kings, of the custody, during minority of the heir, of any lands in Ireland now in the king's hands or hereafter falling into his hands, to the value of 20*l.* a year; he to account at the Exchequer in Dublin for any sum in excess thereof. By p.s. & pet. of C.
