- Oct. 21. Salisbury. Presentation of Thomas de Wakefeld, chaplain, to the church of Merkefeld, in the diocese of Lincoln, in the king's gift by reason of his custody of the land and heir of Robert de Holand, tenant in chief.
- Oct. 18. Salisbury. Licence for John de Dynham to grant his manor of Buclonde Dynham, held in chief, to Matilda de Moleton for life. By fine of 60s. Somerset.
- Sept. 28. Cambridge. Revocation of the king's presentation of William de Derham, king's clerk, to the church of Clopton, in the diocese of Norwich, believed to be in the king's gift, but alleged by Thomas, earl of Norfolk and marshal of England, to belong to him. By K.
- Oct. 14. Marlborough. Protection, with clause *nolumus*, until Easter, for Robert de Hungerford, whom John de Warena, earl of Surrey, has charged with making divers provisions for his use against the coming parliament. The clause *nolumus* applies to the said Robert's manors of Rusteshale, Galston, Stocke, Templeton, Corsleye and Middelton. By K.
- Oct. 22. Salisbury. Grant to the mayor, bailiffs and good men of Oxford, of pontage for six years, for repair of the bridges over the Thames and the Charwell. By p.s.
- Oct. 25. Salisbury. Presentation of John de Wodehous to the church of Wytricheham, in the diocese of Canterbury, in the king's gift by reason of the late voidance of the see. By p.s.
- Oct. 25. Salisbury. Presentation of William de Kildesby to the church of Mottrom, in the diocese of Coventry and Lichfield, in the king's gift by reason of his custody of the land and heir of Robert de Holand, tenant in chief.
- Oct. 22. Salisbury. Confirmation, in mortmain, of divers grants to the prior and canons of Holy Cross, Raygate, viz. of the messuage and land there formerly in the tenure of Richard atte Hethe granted to them by John de Warena, earl of Surrey; of the quit-claim of 3s. yearly rent in Notefeud granted to them by Ralph de Cobbehame, knight; and of the water mill at Wonham, with the pond, watercourse, etc., in Estbechesworth, formerly in the tenure of William de London and Roger de London, and 26s. 8d. yearly rent there, granted to them by Roger son and heir of the said Roger de London of Raygate.
