- Jan. 25.  
St. Albans. Licence for the sub-prioress and convent of Hegham to elect a prioress in the room of Joan, deceased, on petition presented by Matilda Lomere and Sara de Hegham, nuns of the convent.
- Jan. 26.  
St. Albans. Protection, with clause *nolumus*, for one year, for the prior of Donestaple:  
The like for the following :—  
The prioress of Markyate.
- Jan. 29.  
Windsor. William le Boteler of Wemme.  
Thomas Blaket.  
Maurice le Brun.
- Jan. 26.  
St. Albans. Appointment, during pleasure, of Bartholomew de Burghersh to the custody of the body of Tonebruge Castle, and of the forests of Tonebruge and Retherfeld, late of Hugh Daudele. By K.  
Mandate in pursuance to the sheriff of Kent.
- Jan. 28.  
Windsor. Appointment, during pleasure, of the same Bartholomew to the custody of the town of Rochester. By K. & C.  
Writ of aid for him in the said town.
- Jan. 25.  
St. Albans. Licence for Robert de Ardern to crenellate his dwelling houses of Dratton, co. Oxford, and Perchyng, co. Sussex. By p.s.
- Jan. 26.  
St. Albans. Pardon to Alexander de Nevill for acquiring, for life, from Ranulph de Nevill the manor of Raskelf, co. York, held in chief, and entering thereon without licence ; and licence for him to retain the same. By p.s.
- Jan. 29.  
Windsor. Appointment, during minority of the heir, of Normann Darcy to the custody of lands late of Hugh Prilli, tenant in chief, lately held by William Trussel, knight. By p.s.  
Mandates in pursuance to the sheriffs of Cambridge and Lincoln.  
*Vacated because in another form lower down.*
- Jan. 26.  
St. Albans. Licence for Michael de Trenewyth the elder to grant the manors of Elerky, Lanryhoern and Laundege, with the advowson of the church of Lanryhoern, held in chief as of the county of Cornwall, to Thomas son of Odo le Ercedekne, for life ; with remainders to John son of the said Thomas and his heirs by Cicely daughter of Jordan de Haccombe, and to the right heirs of Thomas. By fine of 40s. Cornwall.
- Jan. 28.  
Windsor. Pardon, at the request of queen Isabella, to Isabella Hore, convicted in the late king's reign of breaking open a chest of John de Lyngethorn at Redeburn, co. Hertford, and taking therefrom 28s., whose execution was deferred at the time because she was then with child. By p.s.
- Jan. 30.  
Windsor. The like to Adam Viryng, detained in St. Albans gaol, for the death of John Chaterben, as it appears by the record of Geoffrey le Scrope and other justices of the King's Bench that he killed him in self-defence.
- Jan. 28.  
Windsor. Licence for the alienation in mortmain by John Dunsy to the prior and convent of Muchelham of thirty-five acres of land in Horssy and Manekesye, found by inquisition to be of the clear yearly value of 113s. 9d. ; in part satisfaction of a licence from the late king for them to acquire land and rent, not held in chief, to the yearly value of 20 marks.
