- Alphamston, held in survivorship by John Dunnyng, Christina, his wife, and William his son, and of 2s. 7d. of rent in White Colne and Earl's Colne, held for life by Agnes late the wife of Augod son of Simon. The premises are not held in chief and are worth beyond the said rent and the services due 43s. 6d. yearly, as has been found by inquisition by John de Coggeshale, escheator in the county of Essex.
- July 4.** Appointment of Robert de Stratford, 'mason,' John de Fortho, **Westminster.** Thomas de Grove and William de la Chaumbre to provide masons and other workmen for the works of a hospital of St. Mary by the castle of Leicester which Henry, duke of Lancaster, intends to build, and oratories, houses and other buildings for the habitation of canons and chaplains to celebrate divine service there for the souls of the king's progenitors and the duke, to bring them to the castle and put them to the work at the duke's wages, and to take timber, stone for and other necessaries for the works and carriage for the same. - July 6.** Grant to the king's yeoman Reynold Barber, in compensation for **Westminster.** some houses in Westminster which he lately had of the king's grant and has surrendered into the king's hands, of 60s. yearly at the exchequer, for life or until the king cause him to be provided with the 60s. elsewhere. By p.s.
- July 5.** Exemption, for life, of William Gervois son of Adam Gervois of **Westminster.** Norwich, from being put on assizes, juries or recognitions, and from appointment as mayor, sheriff, escheator, coroner or other bailiff or minister of the king, against his will. By p.s.
- July 5.** Pardon to Roger Palfreyman detained in the Marshalsea prison of **Westminster.** the King's Bench for the death of Thomas Gase, as the king has learned by the record of William de Shareshull and his fellows, justices of the King's Bench, that he killed him in self defence.
- July 9.** Presentation of Henry de Exton, vicar of the church of Lantrissan, **Westminster.** in the diocese of Llandaff, to the church of Thawe, in the same diocese, in the king's gift by reason of his wardship of the lands and heir of Edward le Despenser, tenant in chief; on an exchange of benefices with Griffith ap Jak.
- July 8.** Pardon to Walter Nethird of Romundby of the king's suit for the **Westminster.** death of Robert Carter of Allerton Spitel, as it appears by the record of Thomas de Seton and his fellows, justices appointed to deliver the king's gaol of the castle of York, that he killed him in self defence.

- July 5.** *Inspeximus* and confirmation of a peace or agreement (*in French*), **Westminster.** dated at York, on Tuesday, the feast of St. John the Baptist, 1454, between the abbot and convent of St. Mary's, York, and the mayor and commonalty of the city of York, touching quarrels and debates between them touching the jurisdiction of Bouthum, lately moved before the king and council, which place of Bouthum the abbot and convent claimed as their free borough and the mayor and commonalty laid
