Pardon, of special grace, to Peter Carbonel of the king's suit for the death of John Neville, his servant, whom he killed because he suspected that the said John, whom he saw carrying a pair of paternosters (*precurarum*) which he had given to his wife, had violated his wife, whereof he is indicted or appealed, and of any consequence of outlawry.
