Nov. 21. Licence for the prior and convent of Spaldyng to appropriate the  
Westminster. church of Sibeseye, in the diocese of Lincoln, which is of their ad-  
vowson. By p.s.

Nov. 27. Presentation of John Hoyer, chaplain, to the vicarage of the church  
Westminster. of Bradewelle, in the diocese of Lincoln, void by the resignation of  
William de Waldegrave and in the king's gift by reason of the priory  
of Tykford being in his hands on account of the war with France.

Nov. 25. Grant to David Fox of Ireland that he and his posterity begotten  
Westminster. of his body may use English laws and customs and may freely  
acquire to them and their heirs free tenements; and that they shall  
in no wise be brought under other laws or customs by the king or  
ministers of him or others against their will. By K.

Nov. 1. Notification that the bailiffs and good men of Ipswich have sur-  
Westminster. rendered to the king in the chancery his letters patent dated 22 July,  
26 Edward III, granting to them certain customs.

Nov. 25. Presentation of Matthew son of Adam de Southbirlyngham  
Westminster. chaplain, to the vicarage of the church of Stovene, in the diocese of  
Norwich, in the king's gift by reason of the priory of Wangeford  
being in his hands on account of the war with France.

Nov. 28. Grant for life, for service to the king's daughter Isabel, to Alexandra  
Tower of de la Mote of an annuity of 20 marks at the exchequer. By p.s.  
London. *Vacated because King Richard, on 4 March, in his first year, in  
recompence for this and other sums, granted her 20l. yearly, as appear  
on the Patent Roll of that king. [Calendar, 1377-1381, p. 239.]*

Dec. 2. Pardon to William Parker of the king's suit for the death of John  
Westminster. de Norhampton, as it appears by the record of William de Thorpe  
and his fellows, justices appointed to deliver the gaol of Maidestan  
that he killed him in self defence.

Dec. 2. Pardon of special grace to John Bouche of Suthlegh of the king's  
Westminster. suit for the death of Peter le Taillour of Barnestapell, for his havin
