Moubray, Roger de Blaykeston, Thomas de Ingelby and William Gower of Ingelby, on complaint by Alan de Marton that Richard de Hoton of Aton in Clyveland, John de Neubigging, clerk, Ralph de Brantyngham, Richard de Auldwod, John, vicar of the church of Marton, William Fyntrise, Richard Perour, William son of Richard de Tollesby, Thomas de Fyntrise, John Groute, Thomas Milner of Aton, Henry Jurdan of Aton, William Baker of Aton and others, broke his close and houses at Marton in Clyveland, co. York, and carried away his goods and a chest with deeds, writings and other muniments contained therein.
