Dec. 3. Commission of oyer and terminer to William de Thorpe and
Westminster. William de Notton touching processes begun on indictments made by
virtue of a late commission of oyer and terminer to them, Bartholomev
de Burgherssh, since deceased, and others, touching felonies, tres-
passes, &c. in the county of Kent, and not yet determined; also
touching all felonies and trespasses in the said county and those who
have taken from England wool and other merchandise liable to
custom, contrary to the king's proclamation and prohibition. By C

Dec. 6. Commission to Ralph Spigournel, William de Thorpe, Gerard de
Westminster. Braybrok, William de Notton and Hugh de Sadlyngstanes, reciting
that, whereas Adam Hykedon is indicted before the said Gerard and
William de Notton, lately appointed to enquire touching the names
of evildoers who robbed Adam de Comberhalle of goods to the value
of 100s. at Estwyk, co. Bedford, and killed him, of having robbed
the said Adam there of 13s. 4d. and John Avenel, 'chivaler,' is in-
dicted before them of having received Adam Hykedon after the
felonies, with full knowledge of them, at Holewell, Bedeford and other
places in the county, as by inquisition thereof made by the king's
command by the said Gerard and William de Notton appears, the
king has appointed them to hear and determine his said indictment,
which he sends to them under the foot of his seal.

Dec. 16. Commission of oyer and terminer to Henry Grene, William de
Westminster. Notton, John atte Lee, John Bruyn and John de Lodewyk, on com-
plaint by the king's clerk William de Walcote that John de Wylieu,
clerk, Adam Broun, William Sayer, John Cook, Richard Wymound,
Thomas atte Hull, Thomas Amphill, Thomas Parmounter, John
Gerbaud, Thomas Varre and others, broke his house at Hyche, co.
Hertford, drove away two of his carts with six horses harnessed
therein, worth 10l. carried away his goods and assaulted his men
and servants. For 20s. paid in the hanaper.

Dec. 7. Commission to William de Spaldyng, king's serjeant at arms, to
Westminster. receive from the constable of the castle of Somerton John Avenel,
'chivaler,' now in the prison of the said castle, and to bring him to
Bedeford to be delivered to the sheriff of the county of Bedeford
for safe keeping in the king's prison there until he be delivered ac-
cording to law and the custom of the realm.
