July 13. **Westminster.** The like to David de Roche, knight, Adam de Loundres, knight, John Keppok and Robert Lenfaunt, touching evildoers of Ireland who have entered the castles, manors and lands late of Maurice Fitz Thomas, earl of Desmond, who held of the king in chief, in the king's hands on account of the earl's death and the nonage of his heir, broken houses, gates, doors and windows of those castles and manors and carried away and had their will of the earl's goods there to the value of 6000*l.* arrested by the king's ministers for the earl's debts to the king at his death, and in the keeping of such ministers in the king's name, and others who have occupied the said castles, manors and lands and taken the issues and profits thereof to their own use.

July 18. **Westminster.** The like to Thomas de Bradestan, Simon Basset, William de Chilttenham, Thomas de Sloghtre and John de Lassels, in the county of Gloucester, touching the following trespasses; whereas the king lately appointed Guy de Brien to arrest John Gayner of Aylberton and Thomas, his brother, for trespasses in the king's forest of Dene, and the said Guy, warden of the said forest, would have arrested them at Lydeneye by Walter Vaghan, constable of the castle of St. Briavels and his lieutenant in the forest, and John Billyng, the king's bailiff there, they resisted arrest and with very many others assaulted the said Walter and John and other men and servants of the king and of the said Guy of the said forest and others there and at Aylberton, Piryton and Aure, killed very many from their horses whereon they rode, and chased them as far as the forest and would not surrender to the king's peace.
