- a chaplain to celebrate divine service daily for the king and him in the chapel of St. Anne, Bolewyk, and whereas the said John died before giving effect to the grant and the latters patent have been surrendered, the king has granted licence for Henry, duke of Lancaster, William la Zouche of Haryngworth and Geoffrey Capper to assign in mortmain 10*l.* yearly of land and rent, not held in chief, to two chaplains to celebrate divine service daily in the said chapel in honour of the Virgin Mary and St. Anne, her mother, for the good estate of the king and the said grantors and for their souls when they are dead. - May 5. Presentation of Master William de Cabernaco to the church of Westminster. Brampton, in the diocese of Lincoln, in the king's gift by reason of the priory of St. Neots being in his hands on account of the war with France.
- May 4. Pardon to John Buffry of his outlawry in the husting of London Westminster. for non-appearance before the justices of the Bench to answer Edward Chamberleyn, John de Tamworth and Gilbert de Wenlyngburgh, late proctors of Philip de Weston, dean of the free chapel of Wolvernehampton, touching a plea of debt of 55 marks against William de Ronton, chaplain, and him; he having now surrendered to the Flete prison, as Robert de Thorpe, chief justice, has certified.
- Feb. 20. Exemption, for life, of Richard atte Doune of Snetesham from Westminster. being put on assizes, juries or recognitions, and from appointment as mayor, sheriff, escheator, coroner, collector of tenths or fifteenths, or other bailiff or minister of the king, against his will. By p.s.
- May 5. Licence for the abbot and convent of Whalleye to acquire in mort- Westminster. main land and rent, not held in chief, to the value of 10*l.* yearly. By p.s.
- April 7. Pardon to John de Scotland of Selesy of the king's suit for the death King's of John Bouer, whereof he is indicted or appealed, and of any con- Langley. sequent outlawry; because the king is informed that he killed him in a hot conflict and not of malice. By p.s.
- May 6. Pardon to Hugh de Stubbes of Westburton of his outlawry in the Westminster. county of Nottingham for non-appearance before the king to answer Thomas de Whatton of Stoke touching a plea of trespass; he having now surrendered to the Marshalsea prison, as William de Shareshull, chief justice, has certified.
- May 6. Grant to John de Mohun of Dunsterre, knight, and Joan, his wife, Westminster. of the manor of Stretele, co. Berks, whereof the said John lately enfeoffed Walter de Chiriton, and which has now come into the king's hands among other lands of the said Walter for debts wherein the latter is held to the king; to hold for such time as the manor shall remain in the king's hands wholly discharged of the debts. - May 5. Pardon, at the supplication of the commonalty of England in the Westminster. present Parliament and for a fifteenth for one year granted by the commonalty, of all escapes of prisoners (escapes of convicted clerks from bishop's prisons excepted), and chattels of felons and fugitives
