Nov. 30. Commission of oyer and terminer to Thomas de Lodelowe, Robert Westminster. Bilknap and Andrew de Gildeford, king's serjeant at arms and lieutenant of John de Bello Campo, admiral towards the north as well as towards the west, touching the evildoers who carried away goods of John de Mari and other merchants, laden in divers ships at Bruges in Flanders to be taken to divers parts beyond the seas, boarding the ships off the coast near Romeneye and Lyde, co.
