Feb. 9. Presentation of Richard de Haukedon to the church of Hydon, Westminster. in the diocese of Exeter, in the king's gift by reason of his wardship of the lands and heir of Oliver de Dynham, who held in chief.

Jan. 30. Presentation of Arnold Brocas to the prebend of Stone in the king's Westminster. free chapel of Hastynges, in the diocese of Chichester, void by the resignation of Master Bernard Brocas.

Feb. 1. Pardon to John Moubray of Routh of the king's suit for the death of Westminster. Robert Adlard, as the king has learned by the record of William de Skipwyth and William de Wychyngham, justices appointed to deliver the gaol of the castle of York, that he killed him in self defence.

Feb. 2. The like to Thomas son of Peter de Beltoft for the death of Robert Westminster. de Drax of Salclif, on a like record of Thomas de Ingelby and his fellows, justices appointed to deliver the gaol of the castle of Lincoln.

Jan. 31. Appointment, during pleasure, of Richard Magor to have the office Westminster. of the pesage of wools in the staple of Bristol as others have had it.

Feb. 4. Licence, for 10 marks paid to the king by William de Ingaldisthorp, Westminster. knight, Robert de Grisele, knight, John Unwyne, chaplain, Hugh de Walton, William Hungerford, chaplain, and Robert Hakebeche, for the alienation in mortmain by them of 46 acres of land in Enemeth to a chaplain to celebrate divine service daily in the chapel of St. Edmund, Enemeth, for the souls of Robert de Hakebeche, knight, and Alice, his wife, and for the souls of the grantors and their heirs.

Feb. 5. Appointment of John Spelly and Alexander Parker to hire six Westminster. carpenters, masons, tilers and other workmen for the repair of the houses, walls and other buildings of the manor of Fekenham, now in the hand of Queen Philippa, and take carriage for timber, stones and other things required for the repair, to be paid for promptly out of the queen's money.

Feb. 5. Grant to Richard Sholle of the wardship of a messuage and a carucate Westminster. of land in Kyngeston, co. Hereford, late of Richard Danseye who held of the king in chief, with the marriage of the heir; he doing the real services and other charges due.

Feb. 2. Licence for the prioress and convent of Campesse to acquire in Westminster. mortmain 10*l.* yearly of land and rent, not held in chief. By p.s.  
*Vacated and surrendered because on 5 July, 7 Richard II, they acquired lands to the value of 10 marks yearly in full satisfaction of this licence.*

Feb. 6. Licence, for 60*s.* paid to the king by the master of the hospital of Westminster. lepers of St. Mary Magdalen, Bekles, for the alienation in mortmain by Richard Walkefare, 'chivaler,' Ralph de Hemenhale, 'chivaler,' Thomas Savage, 'chivaler,' John de Ulveston, 'chivaler,' Edmund de Soterle and Alexander de Bouresyerd, parson of the church of Barsham, to him and the brethren and sisters of the hospital, of 20*s.* of rent issuing out of the manors of Barsham and Herst.
